The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jan J. Moore. The Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilman John Riggs

PROPOSAL:

The applicant is requesting a variance from Article V Section 503(C) Table 3 of the *Statesboro Zoning Ordinance* regarding the minimum required side yard setbacks. The applicant would like to decrease the side yard setback from the minimum required ten (10) feet to four (4) feet for renovations, including the construction of a carport, porch and breakfast room. (See **Exhibit A** – Location Map, **Exhibit B** – Site Survey and **Exhibit C** – Floor Plans)

BACKGROUND:

The subject site is currently zoned R-15 (Single-Family Residential) and on June 21, 2016, the applicant submitted a building permit application for the construction of a carport, porch, breakfast room and a kitchen renovation, which was approved June 24, 2016 (See **Exhibit D** – Building Permit Number PD 01561).

The applicant picked up the building permit on July 14, 2016. Prior to beginning construction the applicant was informed by her construction crew that the project may require a variance. The applicant then called later in July with questions regarding a setback variance for the construction of the carport. Staff informed the applicant that she would not need a variance. Once construction of the carport began, the Building Official/Inspector, after completing inspections, notified Planning & Development of the setback issue.

The subject property is located in a residential area with all property lines surrounded by parcels zoned R-15 (Single-Family Residential). The area includes single-family residences to the north, south, east and west. (See **Exhibit A** – Location Map)

The subject site lies within the "Established Residential Neighborhood" character area as identified by the City of Statesboro Future Development Map within the *City of Statesboro Comprehensive Plan*. The traditional residential neighborhoods in the Established area were developed from the late 19th to mid-20th century, and feature connected street grids linked with downtown. Sidewalks should be located on both sides of major streets; lesser streets may have limited facilities. Major corridors in this area may support a mix of residential and commercial uses. As corridors transition from residential to commercial, the original structures should be maintained and renovated whenever possible. Any new structures should respect the existing fabric of the neighborhood, through similar front, side, and rear setbacks.

Statesboro Updated 2015 Comprehensive Plan, Community Agenda page 17.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES (EXCEPT TRANSPORTATION):

The subject site is currently served by city utilities including water and sewer, sanitation, and public safety services.

ENVIRONMENTAL:

The subject property does not contain any wetlands and the request is not expected to have any environmental impact.

ANALYSIS:

I. Whether to grant a variance to eliminate the required side yard setback.

The .62 acre site is currently zoned R-15 (Single-Family Residential). The applicant picked up approved building permit number PD 01516 on July 14, 2016. The applicant contacted staff later in July to inquire about a variance, at which time she was informed she did not need one. Once construction began, the applicant's construction crew informed her she would need a variance in order to place the carport in the proposed area (See **Exhibit E** – Photos of Subject Site). Article V Section 503(C) states that a parcel must have "two side yards, one on each side of the building, together having an aggregate width of not less than 25 feet, but neither having a width of less than ten feet." The applicant is requesting a variance from the minimum 10' side yard setback to a 4' side yard setback (See **Exhibit B** – Site Survey).

Section 1801 of the *Statesboro Zoning Ordinance* lists the following four (4) factors that the Mayor and Council [could] consider to be true in its consideration of a variance request:

- (1) There are special conditions pertaining to the land or structure in question because of its size, shape, topography, or other physical characteristic and that condition is not common to other land or buildings in the general vicinity or in the same zoning district;
- (2) The special conditions and circumstances do not result from the actions of the applicant;
- (3) The application of the ordinance to this particular piece of property would create an unnecessary hardship; and
- (4) Relief, if granted, would not cause substantial detriment to the public good or impair the purposes and intent of the zoning regulations.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval of the variance requested by V 16-12-03 to reduce the minimum side yard setback from 10' to 4'.

PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION:

At its regularly scheduled meeting on January 3, 2017, the Planning Commission voted 4 to 0 to approve the variance requested by application V 16-12-03.






EXHIBIT C: FLOOR PLANS





A. Amend the existing Section 6-4(a) to strike and include following language:

Sec. 6-5. - Application procedure; contents of application; contents to be furnished under oath.

(a) Generally. The applicant for a license or permit under this chapter shall make a written application under oath on the form as proscribed by the City Clerk or his or her designated representative. A floor plan for each licensed premise as defined herein must be submitted with each application for a license under this chapter. At the time of initial application, a sketch from a surveyor registered in the state of Georgia shall be attached to the application which shall certify that all state and local proximity requirements for the proposed location have been met. Except as otherwise provided by law, such application shall be a public record and open to public inspection at a reasonable time and place.

(1) Class B and C licenses shall be issued for a location only if the location complies with the proximity requirements provided by O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21 as measured by the Rules and Regulations promulgated by the Georgia Department of Revenue.

(2) Nothing in this subparagraph shall prohibit a grocery store licensed for the retail sale of only wine and malt beverages for consumption off the premises from selling wine or malt beverages within 100 yards of any college campus. As used in this subparagraph, the term "grocery store" shall, as provided in O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21(a)(1)(B), mean a retail establishment which has a total retail floor space of at least 10,000 square feet of which at least 85 percent is reserved for the sale of food and other nonalcoholic items, and conducts all of its sales inside the building containing its retail floor space and meets all other criteria by this ordinance.

(3) As further provided in O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21(a)(1)(B) the above proximity requirements shall not apply at any location for which a license has been issued prior to July 1, 1981, nor to the renewal of such license. Nor shall the above proximity requirements apply at any location for which a new license is applied for if the sale of wine and beer was lawful at such location at any time during the twelve (12) months immediately preceding such application.

(e) Proximity Requirements; Sales for Consumption on the Premises; local regulation permitted per O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21(b)(3).

(1) Class D, Class E and Class F alcoholic beverage licenses shall not be issued for a location without a certificate from a land surveyor, registered in the state of Georgia, showing a scaled drawing of the location of the proposed premises and the shortest straight line distance from the front door/primary entrance to any church building, school building, educational building, school grounds, college building, or college campus located within a radius of 100 yards of the premises.

(2) No licenses shall be issued under this chapter for any location without a certificate from a land surveyor, registered in the state of Georgia, showing a scaled drawing of the location of the proposed premises and the shortest straight line distance from the front

door/primary entrance to any alcoholic treatment center building located within a radius of 100 yards of the premises.

(2) has been convicted within five years immediately prior to the filing of the alcoholic beverage application with the City Clerk of the violation (i) of any state or federal law pertaining to the manufacture, possession, transportation or sale of malt beverages, wine or intoxicating liquors, or the taxability thereof except a first conviction of selling alcohol to underage persons; (ii) of a crime involving moral turpitude; or (iii) of a crime involving soliciting for prostitution, pandering, gambling, letting premises for prostitution, keeping a disorderly place, the traffic offense of hit and run or leaving the scene of an accident, or any misdemeanor serious traffic offense as defined in O.C.G.A. § 40-6-390 et seq., but excluding any first conviction for reckless driving or driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs in the past 10 years as measured from the date of arrest, or for whom outstanding indictments, accusations or criminal charges exist charging such individual

Chapter 6 Alcoholic Beverages of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Sec. 6-3. - Definitions.

Catered Event: An event where alcoholic beverages are served by a licensed caterer for aparticular function (i.e. retirement dinner, wedding reception, private party) to which the generalpublic is not admitted where food is served, and the total cost of the food exceeds the cost of alcohol. An event where alcoholic beverages are served and/or sold by a licensed caterer for a particular function (i.e. retirement dinner, wedding reception, private party, sporting event, artistic performance) where the general public may be admitted and where food is served and the total cost of food exceed the cost of alcohol. City Council shall have the discretion to approve or deny any request submitted to have a catered event. City council may place any limiting restrictions on the catered event which it deems necessary and may consider factors including the location of the event, times of the event, amount of security provided, and any other factors deemed appropriate by Council in making its determination.

Recommendation: Recommend the approval of awarding of contract to the lowest bidder, Hawk Construction, LLC, for the completion of the training tower and burn building located at the public safety training center on Hwy 301 North in the amount of \$73,560.00.

Background: This project is the last major phase needed to complete the Fire Facilities at the Public Safety Training Center off of 301 North. It includes the construction of the repelling wall on the tower as well as some trim work at the base. It also includes the construction and installation of all doors, vents, platforms, stairs and burn racks for the burn building and the construction and installation of the ventilation simulator on the roof of the burn building. All steel construction for durability and reduced maintenance. The bidding process was conducted as outlined per City Ordinance. The initial bid process yielded only one bid which required the project to be rebidded. At the conclusion of the second process Hawk Construction, LLC, had submitted the only bid in the amount of \$73,560. Per City Ordinance a single bid can be accepted after the completion of a second bidding process. Bid packets were sent to multiple contractors for both processes.

Budget Impact: This project is listed as a CIP project utilizing 2013 SPLOST dollars (FD-62). The amount budgeted for the project is \$81,561.00. Cost associated with maintaining the facilities are expected to be minimal. Additionally, having these
