MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN GEORGIA SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY, THE CITY OF STATESBORO, AND THE BULLOCH COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THE GEORGIA MUTUAL AID ACT

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") is entered into as of the date of the last signature below, by and between the City of Statesboro, the Bulloch County Sheriff's Department and Georgia Southern University, an institution within the University System of Georgia and the Board of Regents for the University System of Georgia (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Parties"). This agreement incorporates by reference standards contained in O.C.G.A. § 36-69-1 et seq., including subsequent amendments thereto.

I. Purpose

WHEREAS, responses to emergency or special circumstances may exceed the immediate resources, skill, and equipment capacities of any Party's law enforcement agency, that Party may request that the other Parties provide certified police officers to assist in providing law enforcement services.

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-69-1 et seq., Georgia Southern University is authorized to furnish assistance extraterritorially to the City of Statesboro or the Bulloch County Sheriff's Department upon the approval of Board of Regents for the University System of Georgia and the President of Georgia Southern University with this MOU.

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-69-1 *et seq.*, the City of Statesboro and/or the Bulloch County Sheriff's Department are authorized to furnish assistance extraterritorially to Georgia Southern University with the approval of the President of Georgia Southern University, as well as the governing body for the local political subdivision or county sheriff, as applicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

- 1. Purpose: The purpose of this MOU is to permit each Party to assign law enforcement officers to the other Party or Parties for law enforcement services within the city of Statesboro or Bulloch County or on the Georgia Southern University campus, as requested by the respective Parties. In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 36-69-8, nothing in this MOU shall be construed as creating a duty on the part of the Parties to respond to a request for assistance, or to stay at the scene of a local emergency for any length of time.
- 2. Requests: Requests for assistance may be made by the authorized representative(s) of each party in a local emergency, in the prevention or detection of violations of any law, in the apprehension or arrest of any person who violates a criminal law of this state, or in any criminal case.
- 3. Authorities: The senior officer of the requesting Party shall be in command of the local emergency as to strategy, tactics, and overall direction of the operations.

- 4. Powers and Duties of Responding Personnel: In accordance with O.C.G.A. § 36-69-4, responding employees of any Party "shall have the same powers, duties, rights, privileges, and immunities as if they were performing their duties in the political subdivision or on the campus of the institution in which they are normally employed."
- 5. Responsibility for Expenses and Compensation of Employees: Parties responding to requests in conformance with this MOU shall pay any expense for furnishing of their own equipment, loss or damage to such equipment, and costs incurred in operation and maintenance of their equipment. Responding Party(ies) shall compensate their respective responding employees during the time they are rendering aid and defray actual travel expenses of those employees. Compensation shall include compensation due to personal injury or death while employees are rendering aid. (O.C.G.A. § 36-69-5)
- 6. Effective Date: This agreement shall take effect upon execution and approval by the hereinafternamed officials, including the Board of Regents for the University System of Georgia, and shall continue in full force and effect unless terminated by any or all of the parties herein.

I appreciate the City Council's and your consideration of me for the above-referenced position. Recently, City Manager Randy Wetmore and City Attorney Cain Smith and I discussed the City's vision for this newly created position and court.

To begin, Randy and Cain envision the court meeting approximately 6 times per year, or every other month. While no one yet knows how much volume the court will face, we initially estimate allotting 5 hours per court date, with roughly 2 hours allotted for my travel time to and from Statesboro and the balance dedicated to court time.

I will charge the City a flat rate of \$850.00, for any of my time on any court day up to 5 hours, including travel time. For any time I spend over the 5-hour limit, for things such as drafting orders of my findings of fact and conclusions of law or appeal responses in contested matters, I will then bill the City at the rate of \$185 per hour.

It also seems that Wednesdays are the best day of the week to hold court, so I propose holding court on the last Wednesday of the month. If the Council and you agree, the Council could vote to begin holding hearings as early as the last Wednesday of this April.

Thank you kindly again for your consideration and I look forward to seeing you soon.



The low bidder, Ellis Wood Contracting, meets the requirements of the bid package and submitted an acceptable bid bond. Staff recommends awarding this contract to Ellis Wood Contracting in the amount of \$569,800, and requests approval to extend unit prices for performing additional city street resurfacing up to the budgeted amount of \$644,078.

Background:

The work in this contract includes asphalt resurfacing and repairs of approximately 3 miles of city streets (see attached list and map), 17,225 square yards of asphalt milling and reinstallation of roadway striping.


Budget Impact:

The low bid submitted by Ellis Wood Contracting is below the budgeted amount of \$644,078. The project is to be paid for through a combination of Georgia Department of Transportation LMIG funds (\$274,078), 2013 SPLOST funds from PWE-ENG-40 Street Resurfacing (\$300,000) and PWE-ENG-119 Major Street Repairs (\$20,000), as well as Solid Waste Disposal Fund revenues (\$50,000) for the resurfacing of the landfill entrance road.
