

Budget in Brief

CITY GOVERNMENT:

The City of Statesboro operates under the Council-Manager form of government. The Mayor is elected at large while the five Council members are elected by district. All terms are for four years with half of the members elected every two years.

- Adopting an Annual Budget
- Passing ordinances
- Setting policy and providing guidance to City Manager

The City Manager is appointed by the Council to head the administrative functions of city government.

- Carrying out policies and ordinances of Council
- Overseeing day-to-day operations of the City
- Preparing recommended Balanced Annual Budgets

Council Adopts FY 2019 Annual Operating Budget & Capital Improvement Program

On June 19th, Mayor and Council Adopted the FY2019 Annual Operating Budget & Capital Improvement Program. The City of Statesboro FY2019 Budget for all appropriated funds totals \$53,829,156 (including transfers) which is an increase of \$216,860 from the FY 2018 Budget.

- The increase is mainly due to the rising cost of health care, the rising cost of natural gas and the increase in technology fees.
- The General Fund budget is \$15,607,791, which is an increase of \$234,699 from FY2018.
- Statesboro Fire Service Fund budget is \$3,545,463.
- Water and Sewer Fund Budget is \$11,429,785.
- Stormwater Fund Budget is \$812,778.
- Natural Gas Fund budget is \$4,498,245.
- Solid Waste Collection Fund budget is \$4,000,845.
- Solid Waste Disposal Fund budget is \$3,882,839.

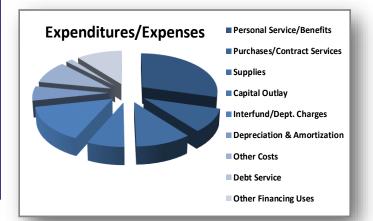
