A regular meeting of the Statesboro City Council was held on January 15, 2013 at 6:00 pm in the Council Chambers at City Hall Present were Mayor Joe R. Brannen, Council Members: Will Britt, Phil Boyum, John Riggs, and Gary Lewis. Also present were City Manager Frank Parker, City Clerk Sue Starling, City Attorney Alvin Leaphart, City Engineer Robert Cheshire and Director of Community Development Mandi Cody. Absent was Councilman Travis Chance.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Joe R. Brannen.

The Invocation was given by Pastor E. Charles Lee and Pledge of Allegiance was given by Councilman Gary Lewis

John Bender spoke in favor of the request. Councilman Riggs made a motion, with staff recommendations, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt to approve **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-06:** Drayton Parker Companies, LLC, requests annexation by the 100% method and rezoning of property located at 6381 Burkhalter Road from HC (Highway Commercial – Bulloch County) to HOC (Highway Oriented Commercial). (Tax parcel # MS88000025000) Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

John Dotson of Maxwell, Reddick and Associates spoke in favor of the annexation. Councilman Boyum made a motion, with staff recommendations, seconded by Councilman Lewis to approve **APPLICATION #AN 12-09-01:** Valnoc, LLC requests annexation by the 100% method into the City of Statesboro and rezoning of approximately 65.91 acres of property located on Cawana Road from HC (Highway Commercial – Bulloch County) and R40 (Single Family Residential – Bulloch County) to R4 (High Density Residential). (Tax Parcel # 092000012000) Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

- C) **APPLICATION # SE 12-11-01:** Mr. Lance Holloway requests a special exception be granted pursuant to the *Statesboro Zoning Ordinance* to allow the operation of a personal care home in an R-4 (High Density Residential) District for property located at 302 Johnson Street. (Tax Map # S11000089000).

Lance Holloway, owner of the property spoke in favor of the special exception. Councilman Lewis made a motion with staff recommendations, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt to approve **APPLICATION # SE 12-11-01:** Mr. Lance Holloway requests a special exception be granted pursuant to the *Statesboro Zoning Ordinance* to allow the operation of a personal care home in an R-4 (High Density Residential) District for property located at 302 Johnson Street. (Tax Map # S11000089000) Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

- D) **APPLICATION # RZ 12-12-01:** Hussey, Gay, Bell & DeYoung, Inc. requests a zoning map amendment from R15 (Single Family Residential) District to CR (Commercial Retail) District for a portion of property located on 701 Gentilly Road. (Tax Parcel # MS73000003000).

C J Chance of Hussey, Gay, Bell and DeYoung spoke in favor of the zoning map amendment. Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Riggs to approve **APPLICATION # RZ 12-12-01**: Hussey, Gay, Bell & DeYoung, Inc. requests a zoning map amendment from R15 (Single Family Residential) District to CR (Commercial Retail) District for a portion of property located on 701 Gentilly Road. (Tax Parcel # MS73000003000) Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

E) **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-02**: The City of Statesboro requests annexation by the 100% method and rezoning of 13.8 acres of property located on Veterans Memorial Parkway from HC (Highway Commercial) to PUD (Planned Unit Development). (Tax Parcel # MS63000026015).

APPLICATION # AN 12-12-03: The City of Statesboro requests annexation by the 100% method and rezoning of property located on Highway 67 from CP (Conservation Preservation – Bulloch County) and HC (Highway Commercial – Bulloch County) to PUD (Planned Unit Development). (Tax Parcel # MS75000021000).

APPLICATION # AN 12-12-05: The City of Statesboro requests annexation by the 100% method and rezoning of property located on Langston Chapel from R80 (Residential – Bulloch County) to PUD (Planned Unit Development). (Tax Parcel # 092000008001).

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Boyum to approve **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-02**, **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-03** and **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-05**. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Director of Planning & Community Development Mandi Cody presented the case reports and recommendations of the staff and Planning Commission to City Council and advised Council that the appropriate annexation ordinances, comprehensive plan updates, and other requirements of the annexation request would be forthcoming for future council consideration for **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-06**, **APPLICATION # AN 12-09-01**, **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-02**, **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-03**, and **APPLICATION # AN 12-12-05**.

Consideration of a Motion to grant a variance from requirements of the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance to Hendley Properties for the project known as Village at Midtown on South College Street.

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Boyum to grant a variance from requirements of the Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance to Hendley Properties for the project known as Village at Midtown on South College Street. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Consideration of a Motion to award a five year copier and maintenance contract to Digital Office Equipment “piggy-backing” the existing contract with the Bulloch County Board of Education

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Riggs to award a five year copier and maintenance contract to Digital Office Equipment “piggy-backing” the existing contract with the Bulloch County Board of Education. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Mayor Joe R. Brannen left the meeting at 7:00 pm. He did not return to the meeting.

Consideration of a Motion to approve Resolution 2013-02: A Resolution to increase the hotel motel tax by 1%.

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Boyum to postpone this item until the first Council meeting in February. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Public Hearing pursuant to Notice of Hearing issued by the Mayor and City Council of Statesboro on January 2, 2013 to Gracious Development, LLC and Lanika Walden.

A hearing was held to hear the case accusing Gracious Development and Lanika Walden of unlawful activities at 323 Johnson Street. City Attorney Alvin Leaphart swore Code Enforcement Officer Eric Short, Director of Public Safety Wendell Turner, Fire Inspector Chris Colson, Building Inspector Chip Godbee and City Manager Frank Parker. These City employees gave testimony and evidence that showed unlawful activity in the establishment.

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Riggs to revoke the special exception request that was granted in October of 2012. Therefore, the location reverts back to a residential area as the business is now closed. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Other Business from City Council

City Manager Frank Parker updated Council on item (D) of the consent agenda. City Attorney Alvin Leaphart would be bringing an Ordinance change to Council to accommodate the request for a brewery. City Manager Frank Parker also asked Council to approve a 2 year contract with Frontier to be the backup provider for the City’s internet. Councilman Boyum made a motion, seconded by Councilman Lewis to approve the 2 year contract with Frontier as the backup provider for the City’s internet. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

At 9:30 pm, City Manager Frank Parker asked Council for an Executive Session on “Personnel Matters”. Councilman Boyum made a motion, seconded by Mayor Pro tem Will Britt to hold an Executive Session with a 5 minute break. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Present were Council Members: Will Britt, Phil Boyum, John Riggs, and Gary Lewis. Also present were City Manager Frank Parker, City Clerk Sue Starling, and City Attorney Alvin Leaphart.

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt called the regular session back to order at 9:55 p.m. with no action taken.

Public Comments (General)

Elizabeth DeWester addressed Council with concerns of the ditch at Blitch Street and Martin Luther King Drive. Council assured Ms. DeWester that procedures were being put in place to correct the issue and should be resolved in the next several months.

Director of Community Development Mandi Cody asked Council to approve a motion to authorize the preparation of a block grant by the Planning Department for the Gordon Street drainage project. Councilman Boyum made a motion, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt to approve the preparation of the block grant. Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote.

Consideration of a Motion to Adjourn

Mayor Pro Tem Will Britt made a motion, seconded by Councilman Riggs to adjourn.

Councilman Britt, Boyum, Riggs and Lewis voted in favor of the motion. The motion carried by a 4-0 vote. The meeting was adjourned at 9:56 pm.

**ORDINANCE 2013 -02:
AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX PROPERTY
INTO THE CITY OF STATESBORO, GEORGIA**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia have received petition from VALNOC, LLC, who is the owner of 100 percent of the property to be annexed; and,

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 36 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, in order to annex property, to provide an effective date and other provisions, the Mayor and City Council must approve an ordinance of annexation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia, in regular session assembled as follows:

Section 1. All that area contiguous to the City of Statesboro described in "Exhibit A," attached hereto and incorporated herein as a part of this ordinance, is hereby annexed into the City of Statesboro and made a part of said city.

Section 2. This ordinance shall become effective on March 1, 2013.

Section 3. The Director of Planning & Community Development of the City of Statesboro is instructed to send a report that includes certified copies of this ordinance, the name of the county in which the property being annexed is located and a letter from the City stating the intent to add the annexed area to the Census maps during the next survey and stating that the survey map will be completed and returned to the United States Census Bureau, Georgia Department of Community Affairs, and to the governing authority of Bulloch County, Georgia within thirty (30) days after the effective date of the annexation as set forth in Section 2.

Section 4. On the effective date of the annexation, this property shall be placed in Council District 5 of the City of Statesboro.

Section 5. This property shall be zoned R4 (High Density Residential) and located in the "Developing" character area as shown on the City of Statesboro Future Development Map pursuant to the vote of the Statesboro City Council held on January 15, 2013 subsequent to a public hearing regarding the zoning of said property.

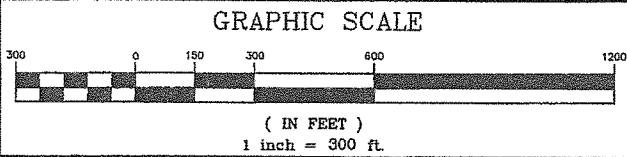

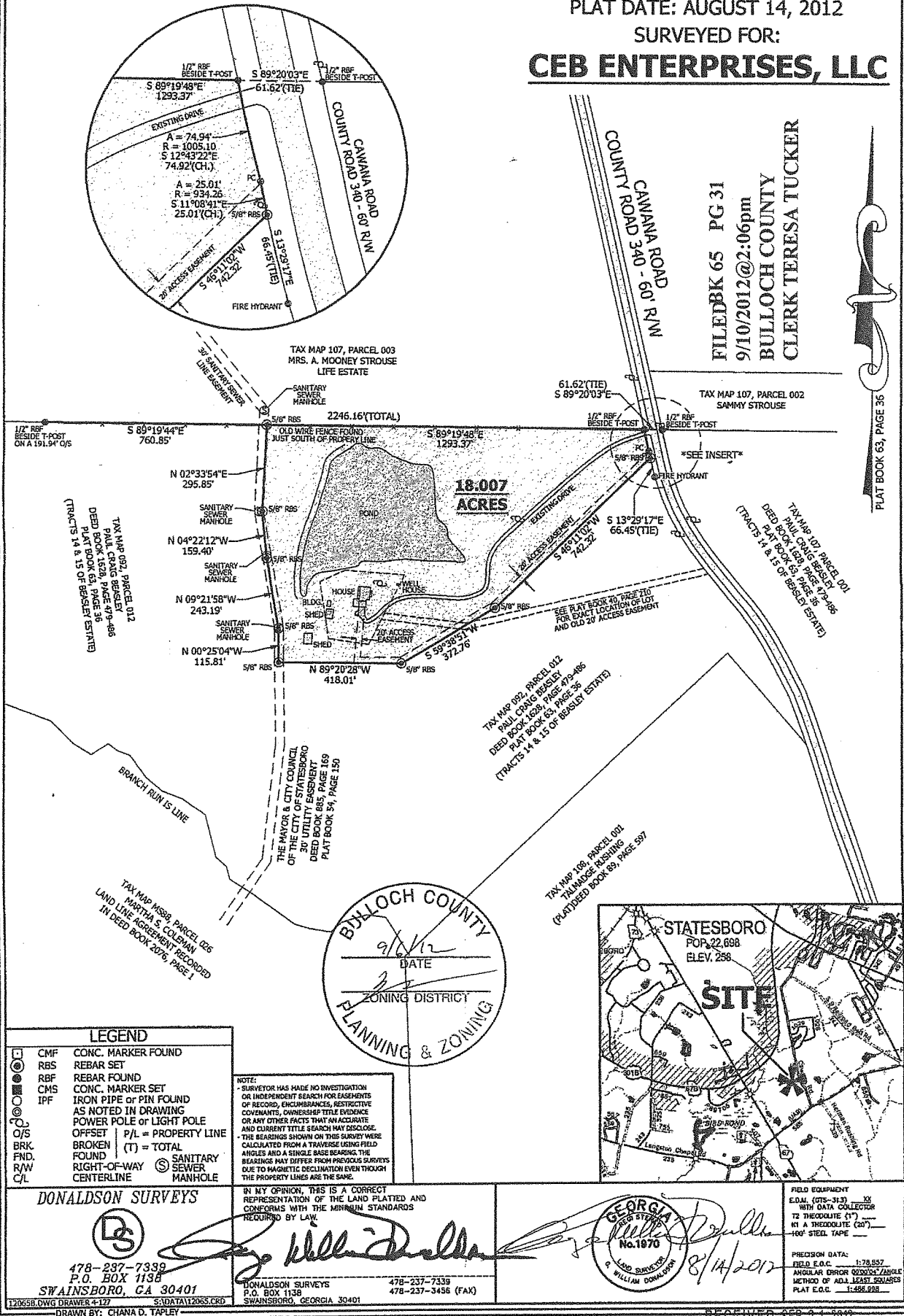

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that additional funding is needed to promote and market the City of Statesboro for tourism development;

WHEREAS, additional funds for such purposes could be realized by increasing the excise tax rate charged for public lodgings within the City to 6%;

Ordinance 2013-01
An Ordinance Amending Certain Sections of Chapter 6 of the Statesboro Code of Ordinances
(Alcoholic Beverages)

WHEREAS, the City has previously adopted an ordinance regulating alcoholic beverages; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council has determined there is sufficient reason and need to amend certain sections of Chapter 6 (Alcoholic Beverages) of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia, in regular session assembled as follows:

SECTION 1:

Section 6-165 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended by replacing it in full, and shall read as follows:

Sec. 6-165. - Pricing of alcoholic beverages.

- (a) This section shall govern retail package licenses and all retail consumption on the premises licenses, but shall not limit or expand any privilege granted by the Commissioner of the Georgia Department of Revenue to a brewer licensed to manufacturer malt beverages authorizing said brewer to conduct educational and promotional brewery tours pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 3-5-38.
- (b) No licensee holding a retail package sale license or any retail consumption on the premises license shall:
 - (1) Offer to deliver any free alcoholic beverage to the general public or at a price less than the wholesale price paid for the alcoholic beverage. This subsection shall not apply to a tasting-room where wine is offered in a quantity to only taste the product.
 - (2) Any on-premises-consumption licensee may sell, offer to sell, or deliver to a person any alcoholic beverage for less than the price customarily charged. This provision does not permit a licensee to sell, offer to sell, or deliver any alcoholic beverages during this period to any person or group at a price lower than is offered to the general public during this period, except at private functions not open to the public.

- (3) Such sales shall only take place on a day when sales of alcoholic beverages for consumption-on-the-premises are allowed by this chapter and state statute.
- (4) Sell, offer to sell, or deliver to any person or group of persons two or more or an unlimited number of alcoholic beverages during any set period of time at a fixed price, except at private functions not open to the public.
- (5) Sponsor, conduct, encourage or allow on the licensed premises any game or contest or promotion which either:
 - a. Involves the drinking of alcoholic beverages or the awarding of alcoholic beverages as the prize; or
 - b. Has as its primary purpose the increasing of the consumption of alcoholic beverages on the premises.
- (6) Sell two or more alcoholic beverages for a price substantially the same as is charged for one such alcoholic beverage.
- (7) Require the purchase of a second or subsequent alcoholic beverage at the same time another alcoholic beverage is purchased.
- (8) Sell, offer to sell, or give away any coupons, tokens, tickets, receipts or other devices authorizing the serving of any alcohol beverage drinks either on the current or a subsequent day.
- (9) Sell, offer to sell, or deliver to a customer in any container other than: (i) a glass or plastic cup for distilled spirits; or (ii) a standard wine glass or plastic cup, carafe or original winery bottle for any wine or fortified wine; or (iii) a glass or plastic cup, pitcher, or the original can or bottle for any beer or malted beverage.
- (10) Sell, offer to sell, or deliver any alcoholic beverage to be inserted into the mouth of a customer in any manner by anyone other than by the customer.
- (11) Charge any minimum charge, cover charge, admission charge, or any other nonfood or nonalcoholic beverage charge which discriminates on the basis of gender, race, creed, or national origin.
- (c) No provision of this section shall be construed to prohibit licensees from offering free food or entertainment at any time, to prohibit the sale or delivery of wine by bottle or carafe when sold with meals to more than one person, to prohibit any hotel or motel from offering room services to registered guests; and does not apply to a movie theater licensed by the City of Statesboro to show movies to the public while offering reduced prices for tickets to matinees to youth under a certain age or to senior citizens.

SECTION 2. All other sections of Chapter 6 not here expressly amended here remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. Should any section, subsection, or provision of this ordinance be ruled invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then all other sections, subsections, and provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after its adoption on two separate readings.

As the cast travels from country to country and city to city, host families generously share their lives and homes with these young people from around the world, and year after year, this proves to be one of the most impactful components of the Up with People experience. The opportunity to live with community members in their homes offers an unparalleled level of cultural immersion, gaining a sense of what real day to day life is like and creating a unique opportunity for international friendships.

PERFORMING ARTS

Up with People was founded on the principle of using the universal language of music as a way to inspire, energize, educate, and communicate. In each city the cast visits, participants perform in a vibrant and moving musical stage show that brings the community together, celebrates the Up with People mission, and integrates the stories of community partners.



Up with People cast members participate in all aspects of a live touring production, and have the opportunity to learn both technical theatre skills and performance skills. Other skill sets learned through the Performing Arts curriculum include public speaking, leadership, teamwork and professionalism—all of which carry on with each participant long after their Up with People experience has concluded.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

In every city they visit throughout the world, cast members are directly exposed to the social needs of the communities. Up with People works to address those needs by providing hours of volunteer service to local charitable organizations and community groups.

Awareness is also created by the donation of ticket sales and spotlighting local charities in concert. Through partnership with corporate sponsors in each town, a giant check representing 100% of all ticket sales is given to a selected charity. Some significant corporate sponsors over the years have included Kodak, General Motors, Coca Cola, Toyota, Hersey Chocolate, Volkswagen, Chevrolet, Honeywell, and many others. The beneficiaries of Up with People's community impact have included such organizations as Habitat for Humanity, the Boys and Girls Club, the African Community Center, and several others.
