A RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A TEMPORARY SIX MONTH MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE, ISSUANCE, AND PROCESSING OF OCCUPATIONAL TAX CERTIFICATES TO OPERATE A BUSINESS CONTAINING MORE THAN SIX (6) CLASS B COIN OPERATED AMUSEMENT MACHINES WITHIN THE CITY OF STATESBORO.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City of Statesboro, Georgia is authorized under Article 9, Section 2, of the Constitution of the State of Georgia to enact reasonable ordinances to protect the health, safety, and quiet enjoyment of its citizenry;

WHEREAS, the duly elected governing authority of the City of Statesboro, Georgia is the Mayor and City Council thereof;

WHEREAS, House Bill 487, which address the regulation of coin operated amusement machines and further defines the extent of local government regulation of those businesses was recently passed by the General Assembly and signed into law by the Governor;

WHEREAS, House Bill 487 defines a Class B coin operated amusement machine as a bona fide coin operated amusement machine that allows a successful player to accrue points on the machine and carry over points won on one play to subsequent play or plays in accordance with paragraph (2) of subsection (d) of O.C.G.A. § 16-12-35 and (A) rewards a successful player in compliance with the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of subsection (d) of O.C.G.A. § 16-12-35; and (B) does not reward a successful player with any item prohibited as a reward in subsection (i) of O.C.G.A. § 16-12-35 or any reward redeemable as an item prohibited as a reward in subsection (i) of O.C.G.A. § 16-12-35;

WHEREAS, the Georgia Supreme Court, in the case of <u>DeKalb County v. Townsend</u>, 243 Ga. 80 (1979), has held that, "To justify a moratorium, it must appear first, that the interests of the public generally, as distinguished from those of a particular class, require such interference; and second, that the means are reasonably necessary for the accomplishment of the purpose, and not unduly oppressive upon individuals";

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council may legitimately regulate the location and operation of businesses within its city limits, including businesses which operate Class B coin operated amusement machines:

WHEREAS, the City of Statesboro's current zoning ordinance does not specifically address Class B coin operated amusement machines, as described within this Resolution;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council are aware that the Georgia Municipal Association is currently drafting a model ordinance in compliance with the regulatory structure of House Bill 487;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Statesboro need time to research and study how these businesses operate and determine what type of zoning classifications should apply;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of Statesboro require time to study the economic impact and social implications of such establishments on the fabric of the community;

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council believe that a moratorium on the acceptance and processing of applications for licenses and Occupational Tax Certificates to operate a business that contains more than SIX (6) Class B coin operated amusement machines; , as defined herein, and on the issuance of such licenses, will not deny property owners economically viable use of their property, and will afford the Mayor and City Council the time necessary to put into place reasonable zoning regulations to further the aforesaid purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the City of Statesboro, and it is hereby resolved by the authority of the same, that no license or occupational tax certificate for the operation of a business that contains more than SIX (6) Class B coin operated amusement machines, as defined above, be accepted, approved, or, for those applications already filed, processed during this six (6) month period.

This moratorium shall be in effect immediately upon passage and expire six (6) months from the effective date of this Resolution, upon adoption by the City of an applicable zoning ordinance, upon the adoption of an ordinance substantially similar to model ordinance under review by the Georgia Municipal Association, or repeal by the City Council, whichever occurs first.

This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public health, safety, and general welfare of the City and its residents and property owners, and for the further reason that it is necessary to impose an immediate moratorium to have a pause for planning purposes so as to further the orderly development of the City with respect to the establishment and operation of businesses that contains more than SIX (6) Class B coin operated amusement machines, to adopt well thought-out and contemporary zoning and business regulations for the City and to protect the public interest and rights of property owners. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after its adoption.

The Mayor and City Council may extend the moratorium established by this ordinance upon a finding by the Mayor and City Council that the problems that gave rise to the original moratorium continue to exist and that progress is being made by the City but that additional time is necessary to adequately address the issues facing the City.

The Mayor and City Council may authorize exceptions to the moratorium imposed by this ordinance when it finds, based upon substantial competent evidence presented to it, that the deferral of action on an application for a zoning permit or any city issued license for the duration of the moratorium would impose an extraordinary hardship on a landowner or petitioner.

Any request for an exception from the moratorium imposed by this ordinance shall be filed in writing with the City Manager and shall include the name of the requester, the name and address of the proposed location, the relationship of the requester to the proposed business and location, a recitation of the facts which are alleged to support a claim for an extraordinary hardship, and other information the City Manager deems necessary for the Mayor and City Council to be informed with respect to the request, and shall be signed and notarized.

At least one public hearing on any request for an exception for an extraordinary hardship under the moratorium shall be held by the Mayor and City Council before the Mayor and City Council may take action on such request.

When the Mayor and City Council is tasked with reviewing a written application for an exception for the moratorium imposed by this ordinance due to a claim of an extraordinary hardship they shall consider, at a minimum, the following criteria, but final discretion shall remain with the Mayor and City Council:

- (1) Whether, prior to the effective date of this ordinance, the applicant has received any permits or licenses from the city for such business; and
- (2) Whether, prior to the effective date of this ordinance, the applicant has made substantial expenditures of money or resources in reliance of those permits or licenses which may have been issued by the city; and
- (3) Whether, prior to the effective date of this ordinance, the applicant has contractual commitments in reliance of those permits or licenses which many been issued by the city; and
- (4) Whether, prior to the effective date of this ordinance, the applicant has incurred any financial obligations to a lending institution which, despite a thorough review of alternative solutions, the applicant cannot meet those financial obligations unless granted an exemption and the opportunity to conduct business; and
- (5) Whether the moratorium will expose the applicant substantial monetary liability to third parties or would leave the applicant unable to earn a reasonable return on any investment made on the real property affected by this ordinance; and
- (6) The history and location of the property, including past commercial business uses of the property, if any; and
- (7) Any staff report which may have been created based upon the application for an exemption from the moratorium imposed by this ordinance; and
- (8) Any other criteria the Mayor and City Council deems pertinent to deciding whether such exemption from the moratorium imposed by this ordinance should be granted.

Nothing in this resolution shall be construed to legalize, license or authorize any operation of a device which is unlawful to operate under the laws of the State or Georgia.

This moratorium may be terminated by the Mayor and City Council prior to the stated expiration upon the adoption by the Council of appropriate zoning or regulatory ordinances.

This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption by the City Council.

Ordinance 2013-06

An Ordinance Amending Certain Sections of ARTICLE III of Chapter 18 of the Statesboro Code of Ordinances

(Pawnbrokers, Secondhand Dealers, and Dealers in Precious Metals and Gems)

WHEREAS, the City has previously adopted an ordinance regulating pawnbrokers, secondhand dealers, and dealers in precious metals and gems; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council has determined there is sufficient reason and need to amend certain sections of Article III of Chapter 18 (Pawnbrokers, Secondhand Dealers, and Dealers in Precious Metals and Gems) of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia, in regular session assembled as follows:

SECTION 1:

Section 18-56 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Sec. 18-56. Definitions.

As used in this Article the term:

Dealer in precious metals and gems means any person, whether as owner, agent or employee, who engages in the business of purchasing precious metals or gems or articles containing any precious metal or gems from members of the general public for resale to brokers, dealers or melters.

Electronic Reporting System means a computer based system, as specified by the Director of Public Safety, which is designed to record and transmit data and information electronically.

Gems means any precious or semiprecious stone which is cut and polished.

Goods means every species of tangible personal property.

Pawnbroker means any person, whether as owner, agent or employee, engaged in whole or in part in the business of lending money on the security of pledged goods, or in the business of purchasing tangible personal property on the condition that it may be redeemed or repurchased by the seller for a fixed price within a fixed period of time, or in the business of purchasing tangible personal property from persons or sources other than manufacturers or licensed dealers as a part of or in conjunction with the business activities described in this section.

Pawnshop means any person, whether as owner, agent or employee engaged in whole or in part in the business of lending money on the security of pledged goods, or in the business of purchasing tangible personal property on the condition that it may be redeemed or repurchased by the seller for a fixed price within a fixed period of time, or in the business of purchasing tangible personal property from persons or sources other than manufacturers or licensed dealers as a part of or in conjunction with the business activities described in this section.

Person means an individual, partnership, corporation, joint venture, trust, association, or other legal entity however organized.

Secondhand Dealer means any person, whether as owner, agent or employee whose business includes purchasing, storing, selling, or exchanging, and receiving-secondhand personal property of any kind, or description. However any person, whether as owner, agent or employee whose business is the purchase and resale of clothing, furniture, or the resale of goods that are donated to the business as a charitable donation shall not be deemed a secondhand dealer under this Article.

Precious metals means gold, silver or platinum or any metal containing gold, silver or platinum.

SECTION 2:

Section 18-67 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Sec. 18-67. Records and information to be recorded.

Every person or business engaged as a pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, and dealer in precious metals and gems within the city shall secure from every person from whom he receives any goods, except used books, whether by purchase or through pledge, trade, pawn or exchange, the following:

- (a) Government-issued photo identification card, such as a driver's license, military identification card, state identification card or passport;
- (b) The name, address, telephone number, race, sex, height, weight, date of birth, and a social security or driver's license number;
- (c) A digital photograph clearly showing a frontal view of the subject's face. Each digital image shall be labeled with the date and time of the transaction and stored in such a manner that they are safe from corruption. If the same subject makes additional transactions within THIRTY (30) DAYS of the original transaction; provides the same government issued photo identification card as provided above, and the subject's appearance has not materially changed a new digital photograph

shall not be required until a transaction is made after THIRTY (30) DAYS from the original transaction.

- (d) A complete and accurate description of the goods acquired, and a digital photograph of the goods acquired including the following information, if available:
 - a. Brand name.
 - b. Model number.
 - c. Manufacturer's serial number.
 - d. Size.
 - e. Color, as apparent to the untrained eye.
 - f. Precious metal type, weight, and content if known-
 - g. Gemstone description, including the number of stones.
 - h. In the case of firearms, the type of action, caliber or gauge, number of barrels, barrel length, and finish.
 - i. Any other unique identifying marks, numbers, or letters.
 - k. The date and time of the transaction.
- (e) The pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, and dealer in precious metals and gems shall maintain the above information and digital photographs for a period of three years and make the same available to law enforcement personnel upon request.
- (f) The pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, and dealer in precious metals and gems shall require the seller to sign a statement verifying that the seller is the rightful owner of the goods or is entitled to sell, consign, or trade the goods.
- (g) Section 18-67 shall not apply to the receipt of used books or pawn transactions commonly known as "title pawn" transactions where the pawnbroker takes possession of a motor vehicle certificate of title; takes a security interest in the motor vehicle certificate of title, and retains physical possession of the vehicle certificate of title for the entire length of the pawn transaction.

SECTION 3:

Section 18-69 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Sec. 18-69. Report to police; required format.

- (a) Every pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, and dealer in precious metals and gems located within the city shall make a computer-generated daily report, in such format as prescribed by the Director of Public Safety, of all transactions that occurred during the 24-hour period ending at 9:00 p.m. on the date of the report. A report shall be made each day prior to 11:59 p.m. for each day the operator or dealer transacts business. If an operator or dealer is closed or does not otherwise engage in any transactions on a particular day, a report indicating "no transactions" shall be filed for that day. Daily reports shall be filed electronically by posting to a law enforcement web site designated by the Director of Public Safety. Where technological problems prevent posting the daily report electronically, a printed, typed or legibly handwritten report shall be delivered to the police department in lieu thereof.
- (b) Section 18-69 shall not apply to the receipt of used books or pawn transactions commonly known as "title pawn" transactions where the pawnbroker takes possession of a motor vehicle certificate of title; takes a security interest in the motor vehicle certificate of title, and retains physical possession of the vehicle certificate of title for the entire length of the pawn transaction.

SECTION 4:

Section 18-71 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Statesboro, Georgia is hereby amended and shall read as follows:

Sec. 18-71. Hold Period; Police holds

- (a) Any pawnshop, secondhand dealer or person operating under a license granted pursuant to this Article who takes goods on pawn, taking full title thereto, shall hold the goods so taken in pawn for at least THIRTY (30) days before disposing of the goods by sale, transfer, shipment or otherwise.
- (b) Any pawnshop, secondhand dealer or dealer in precious metals and gems person operating under a pawnbroker's license who buys goods, taking full title thereto shall hold the goods so taken in on purchase for at least TEN (10) days before disposing of the goods by sale, transfer, shipment or otherwise.
- (c) The Statesboro Police Department or any other Law Enforcement Agency has the authority to place property that is the subject of police investigation on police hold. In that event, the Statesboro Police Department or other Law Enforcement Agency shall notify the pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, or dealer in precious

metals and gems of the need for a police hold and identify all property subject to the police hold. Upon notification, it shall be the responsibility of the pawnbroker, pawnshop, secondhand dealer, or dealer in precious metals and gems to maintain the subject property until such time as the property is released from police hold status or the property is confiscated as evidence.

SECTION 5. All other sections of ARTICLE III of Chapter 18 not here expressly amended here remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. Should any section, subsection, or provision of this ordinance be ruled invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then all other sections, subsections, and provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect from and after its adoption on two separate readings.

Included within your packet today is a proposed amendment to Article XV of the *Statesboro Zoning Ordinance* regarding signage. As shown on the strike through version attached, the proposed change would amend the definition of LED to eliminate the prohibition against the use of this technology in signs permitted within the City of Statesboro. The proposed change would also allow the use of this technology for the display of fuel and gasoline signage within the City with the provision that the signage, including the electronic fuel numbers, meets the dimensional and other requirements provided for within the ordinance.

ORDINANCE #2013-07:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE STATESBORO ZONING ORDINANCE – APPENDIX A OF THE STATESBORO CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, the City has previously adopted an ordinance regulating the use of land commonly known as the Statesboro Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, staff has determined there is sufficient reason and need to amend the Statesboro Zoning Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia in regular session assembled as follows:

Section 1. Appendix A, Article XV (SIGNS) of the Statesboro Municipal Code is hereby amended by the following:

A. Section 1510 – CHANGEABLE COPY SIGNS

- **(B):** Changeable copy signs. Changeable copy signs are permitted as an integral part of any permanent signs which meet all other requirements of this ordinance [article] and further subject to the following restrictions:
 - (1): The changeable copy portion of the sign shall not exceed 50 percent of the overall display surface area of the sign, or 20 square feet, whichever is less. Manual and electronic changeable copy fuel price digits shall not be counted in the permitted changeable copy area so long as they comply with the overall area limitations for the signs on which they are placed.

(14) LED sign. Any sign or portion thereof that utilizes light emitting diode technology or other similar semi-conductor technology to produce an illuminated image, picture, or message of any kind whether the image, picture, or message is moving or stationary. This type of sign includes any sign that uses LED technology of any kind whether conventional (using discrete LEDs), surface mounted (otherwise known as individually mounted LEDs), transmissive, organic light emitting diodes (OLED), light emitting polymer (LEP), organic electro polymer (OEL), or any other similar technology. For purposes of this article, a LED sign is not considered to be a form of changeable copy sign.

Section 2. Should any section, subsection, or provision of this ordinance be ruled invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then all other sections, subsections, and provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
