The City Manager's office is working to establish a protocol for all boards and commissions. The elected body has been presented with a draft and will make decisions. This is to ensure that all boards and commissions are running consistently, as the elected body has outlined.

The city transit buses have officially started running routes on a daily basis throughout Statesboro. There is currently a fee of \$1 to ride the transit or purchase a pass for long-term ridership.
