A Work Session of the Statesboro City Council was held on January 20, 2026 at 3:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 50 East Main Street. Present was Mayor Pro Tem Shari Barr; Council Members: Tangie Johnson and Paulette Chavers. Also present was City Clerk Leah Harden, City Attorney Cain Smith, City Manager Charles Penny, Assistant City Manager Jason Boyles and Public Affairs Manager Layne Phillips. Absent was Mayor Jonathan McCollar; Councilmembers Ginny Hendley and John Riggs.

1. Fire Service Fee

Ed DiTommo from GMC presented an update on the fire service fee study. He began by explaining that the goal was to establish fiscal responsibility and take pressure off the general fund while ensuring the fire department has the necessary resources to maintain high service levels. He showed that the fire department budget has doubled over the past five years, largely due to staffing increases to accommodate population growth. Without the Special Service District, the department now faces a \$4.2 million funding gap. Most cities use either a fire fee specific to fire services or a millage tax to pay for the services. He explained the differences between fees and taxes for municipal services. Fees are more stable as they are set for specific services, while taxes fluctuate with property values. The proposed fee would be calculated based on land use categories: residential, non-residential, and undeveloped property.

Mr. DiTommo noted that several municipalities in Georgia use different methods for fire fees, with some facing legal challenges. Chatham County lost a lawsuit over their fee structure, while Garden City settled their case and switched to a millage rate. McDuffie County's fee (which uses the same methodology being proposed for Statesboro) was upheld in Superior Court.

The recommended rate structure would be:

- 1¢ per square foot monthly for residential properties
- 2¢ per square foot monthly for commercial properties
- \$5 per acre for undeveloped land (maximum \$200)

This would generate approximately \$4 million annually. The average residential customer would pay about \$23 monthly (\$280 annually), while commercial customers would average \$140 monthly. Comparatively, achieving the same revenue through millage would require about 4 mills. He showed pictures that included comparisons showing how various properties would fare under both systems, and also detailed a credit policy where property owners could receive discounts for having sprinkler systems, fire safety devices, emergency operation plans, and other preparedness measures. Next steps include finalizing the billing methodology, conducting public outreach sessions, developing FAQs, meeting with key stakeholders, and creating informational materials before presenting an ordinance to Council later in the spring.

Fire Chief Tim Grams noted that approximately 25% of Statesboro's property is tax-exempt, which would make the fee a more equitable approach.

City Manager Penny emphasized that while some are concerned about legal challenges, the city must fund fire services one way or another by July 1. He also mentioned that FLOST will provide property tax relief in July 2027, along with new properties coming onto the tax rolls to help with revenue.

2. West Main Streetscape Project

Tom Dunaway from Cranston Engineering presented an update on the West Main Streetscape Project, which includes work on both West and East Main Streets. The project is nearing readiness for bidding, with only a few construction easements still needed from property owners.

Tom Dunaway stated the West Main portion extends from College Street to Railroad Street, while East Main work will be primarily aesthetic. The West Main design will include: Maintain two driving lanes, remove most on-street parking (keeping only 6 spaces), replace parking with enhanced pedestrian corridors, create new hardscapes with brick accents and improved accessibility, add new street lighting and American Elm trees, convert North and South Walnut to one-way streets away from Main Street, add a new parking lot near College Street with 35 spaces (including 3 EV and 2 accessible spaces)

The East Main improvements will include: mill and repave the road, rebuild crosswalks, replace street trees, significant drainage improvements (increasing from 2 to more inlets)

The project will be constructed in blocks from low to high (working toward Main Street). The estimated costs are \$500,000 for the parking lot, \$1.75 million for West Main, and \$1 million for East Main. Final drawings are expected soon, with bid dates to follow.

Council member Shari Barr asked about bicycle racks and tree species. Brad Deal stated they had American elm for the street trees. Brad Deal also confirmed they would look into adding bike racks, particularly near the transit station on College Street. He also noted they've already held stakeholder meetings. City Manager Charles Penny stated they will conduct additional meetings before construction begins to help businesses prepare.

3. Annual Report updates

Layne Phillips, Public Affairs Manager, presented information about the city's first annual report, titled "Reflections Magazine." The 38-page publication will highlight city accomplishments from 2025, provide transparency, strengthen public trust, and increase engagement. The magazine will include news stories, financial breakdowns explaining where tax dollars go, and resident resources such as utility discount programs and rebate information. The report is being produced locally with Davis Marketing Company handling design and layout and Lewis Color handling printing and distribution. It will be mailed to Statesboro residents, business owners within city limits, and city employees. The estimated cost is approximately 75 cents per issue for 35,000 copies, with expected delivery in the second week of February.

City Manager Penny noted that while some residents might question the expense, the publication provides an important opportunity for the city to tell its complete story beyond what space constraints allow in local newspapers.

4. Website update

Layne Phillips, Public Affairs Manager, provided an update on the city's website redesign project, which began in June 2025. The objectives include modernizing the site to better reflect the innovative nature of the organization, making it responsive and mobile-friendly (95% of visitors use mobile devices), improving navigation and search, and enhancing accessibility including screen reader compatibility.

After a competitive process, Revise was selected as the vendor based on their 30 years of experience with government websites. The project is currently in the sitemap navigation phase, with content migration coming in the next two weeks. The target launch date is April 2026. The redesign will also bring the police and fire department websites, which currently operate separately, under the main city website umbrella while maintaining their distinct identities.

Key features of the new website include:

- 24/7 support center
- AI chatbot to help answer visitor questions
- Document center for agendas and minutes
- E-notify system allowing residents to sign up for text/email alerts
- Improved bid posting system
- Language translation
- Content scheduler

Councilmember Shari Barr expressed concern about AI potentially "hallucinating" or providing incorrect information, which Layne acknowledged is a risk they'll mitigate by ensuring content is kept current and accurate.

5. Septic Tank Haulers

Matt Aycock, Director of Public Utilities presented a proposal for the city to resume accepting septic waste, which it had stopped doing in 2013 due to operational challenges primarily related to grease waste from restaurants. He explained that the city has made plant upgrades since then that would allow for accepting residential septic waste (though not grease waste).

Matt noted there is increasing demand for this service, with local haulers currently having to travel to Savannah to dispose of waste, which adds significant expense. He proposed implementing standard operating procedures to ensure operators can regulate what is being brought to the facility. The short-term plan is to begin accepting septic waste starting March 1, 2026, with a fee structure to be presented to Council next month. The long-term plan includes developing a dedicated septic receiving station similar to what Pooler has implemented, where trucks can connect to a screened system that processes waste before it reaches the treatment plant. This has been included in the CIP, and staff are obtaining cost estimates.

City Manager Penny noted that while Bulloch County is exploring similar services in the southern part of the county, that project is still in development and would primarily serve the area along I-16. He emphasized that this service would benefit haulers operating within Statesboro and Bulloch County.

6. CDBG Application

Justin Williams presented information about a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application the city is preparing to submit by the April 10 deadline. While the city has focused on housing rehabilitation in recent years, they have not been successful in receiving housing CDBG funding. The last housing CDBG the city received was in 2001 for Statesboro Point.

To avoid missing out on CDBG funding altogether, staff is proposing to shift back to infrastructure projects, which have been more successful in the past. The targeted area includes Roundtree Street and Church Street, neighborhoods where the city has previously done housing rehabilitation and reconstruction. The project would include:

- replacing 1-2 inch lines with 6-inch lines for adequate fire protection
- Water Line Upgrades
- Drainage improvements
- Curbing, gutters, and new sidewalks
- Street resurfacing

The application will request \$1 million with matching funds of \$875,000 from stormwater funds (\$375,000) and water/sewer funds (\$500,000). This exceeds the required 15% match, which will earn the application extra points. The city is currently reviewing bids for engineering and grant administration services, which will be presented to Council on February 3. Public meetings and neighborhood surveying will also take place throughout February.

City Manager Charles Penny emphasized that while the city is not giving up on housing rehabilitation, they need to be practical about what funding they can secure. He noted that city officials had recently met with state representatives to advocate for housing rehabilitation funding, but in the meantime, these infrastructure improvements are necessary for the community.

The meeting was adjourned at 4:57 pm.

7. Public Comments (General):

Len Fatica provided an update regarding Bulloch VOAD's warming shelter operations. He reported that a shelter has been open at Pittman Park since Sunday due to extreme weather and is scheduled to close tomorrow morning. He noted that warming center deployments have increased significantly, rising from an average of one per year in 2017 to six or seven in 2024.

Mr. Fatica expressed concern regarding the lack of facilities for extended operations, especially with forecasts predicting six to eight days of below-freezing temperatures this coming week. There are currently 14 individuals utilizing the shelter, and Councilmember Paulette Chavers recently visited to observe the operations.

Mr. Fatica suggested a collaboration between the city and county on securing a long-term facility for extended shelter needs. Bulloch VOAD has Red Cross-trained staff and can access additional volunteers to prevent burnout during longer operations, but a stable location remains the primary obstacle.

8. Other Business from City Council

Mayor Pro Tem Shari Barr highlighted two community resources:

- The local food bank, under director Sheila Stewart Leach, is serving free meals to 40-60 people Monday through Friday from 12-1 PM, with no questions asked.
- A point-in-time count of unhoused individuals will take place on January 26th, coordinated by Katie Brown at Union Mission, and volunteers are needed to help with the count.

9. City Managers Comments

City Manager Charles Penny provided several updates:

- Code Red emergency notification system: On-Solve, the company that provided these services experienced a security breach last fall and is no longer eligible to make emergency notifications per FEMA. The city and county are working to select a replacement service at a cost of approximately \$1,500 more than On-Solve.
- Notices to proceed have been issued to EMC and Michael Baker for the Creek on the Blue Mile project.
- A non-binding letter was sent to Georgia Power regarding data centers. While no specific company has expressed interest yet, preparation work takes about 12 months, so the city is being proactive.
- City officials will be touring data centers in Atlanta on Thursday before attending the GMA Cities United Summit. They will view both large and small facilities and meet with city officials and Georgia Power to gather information for potential future decisions.
- The city partnered with Beta Gamma Gamma Foundation, Greek organizations, Masonic Lodges, and community businesses to provide toys, bikes, and gift cards for children in need during the holidays. Over \$5,000 was collected from businesses and individuals for this effort.

Mayor Pro Tem Shari Barr also noted that the community held several events celebrating Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day, including an NAACP-sponsored parade despite the cold weather.

Policy Issue: Procurement and Award of Contract

Recommendation: Engineering staff recommends approval of the award of a contract with Parker Engineering, LLC to provide engineering design services for the proposed FY 2026 CDBG project for Roundtree Street and Church Street under STM-24.

Background: Staff solicited a Request for Qualifications and Proposals for professional engineering design services for the FY 2026 CDBG application from December 9, 2025 to January 12, 2026. A total of four responses were received. Staff scored the responses based on criteria listed in the solicitation. As a result of the evaluations, staff selected Parker Engineering, LLC. for the project. Parker has completed numerous design contracts for CDBG projects, including some projects for the City of Statesboro.

The proposed project includes utility, drainage, and sidewalk improvements to Roundtree Street and Church Street. The contract would include a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) for the application as well as design and construction administration services.

Budget Impact: Staff proposes to apply for CDBG funding (estimated at \$1,000,000) for the project. The required match of 10% is \$100,000. STM-24 has \$375,000 in SPLOST funds budgeted for FY 2026. Water/Sewer is also proposing \$500,000 in SPLOST funds for FY 2027. Parker's proposal has no fee for the PER, and a fee of 11% of the construction estimate for engineering and construction administration services.

Policy Issue: Subdivision Regulations, Street Dedication

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of the road and right-of-way dedications for Stockyard West Subdivision Phases 1 and 2. Staff requests consideration of a motion for Council to authorize the Mayor to execute the attached resolution authorizing the Mayor to accept the roads and rights-of-way on behalf of the City of Statesboro.

Background:

In November 2023, the Statesboro City Council approved a preliminary plat for the Stockyard West Subdivision on Stockyard Road, which initiated subsequent infrastructure developments, including road construction. Inspections on the road construction were completed for subgrade and GAB in 2025. The developer now desires to dedicate these roads, Corral Court, Longhorn Court, Cowbell Circle, Timber Road, Pasture Lane, and Haystack Hollow to the City of Statesboro. Acceptable completion and warranty bonds have been provided by the developer.

Budget Impact:

The City of Statesboro will maintain the roadway and limits of right-of-way. No funds will be required in FY2026.

RE: Recommendation of Bus Stop Shelter Purchase for Statesboro Area Transit (SAT)

Policy Issue: Purchasing

Recommendation:

The Engineering Department recommends approval of the purchase and installation of three Poligon bus stop shelters from Hasley Recreation for Statesboro Area Transit, including two large shelters and one small shelter, with total expenditures not to exceed \$65,000, inclusive of shelter material procurement, freight, installation materials, and accessories.

Background:

SAT continues to experience steady ridership at several high-use bus stops throughout the system. Providing adequate passenger amenities, including covered shelters, is essential to improving rider comfort, safety, and overall service quality. Initially, staff proposed the purchase of two small shelters and one large shelter, as reflected on the quote. However, after reviewing ridership patterns and on-site conditions, staff determined that a larger shelter is warranted at the Social Security Office bus stop due to consistently higher passenger volumes at that location. As a result, the proposed configuration has been revised to two large shelters and one small shelter.

The following proposed shelters and locations were selected based on ridership levels, passenger wait times, and the need for improved weather protection:

- (2) Large Shelters (6 ft x 15 ft): Social Security Office bus stop and the Food Bank bus stop

The total estimated cost for the bus shelter purchase is \$57,837.16. This total remains well within the requested authorization limit of \$65,000, allowing adequate contingency for installation materials, accessories, and site-specific requirements. Installation will be performed by the Streets Division of Public Works.





Policy Issue: Contract Amendment

Recommendation: Engineering staff recommends approval of the proposed Contract Amendment 1 in the amount of \$44,000.

Background:

A contract with TR Long Engineering for design services on the ENG-115b Blue Mile Phase 2 project was approved by City Council on December 19, 2023. The project is a continuation of the Blue Mile roadway improvements, which include drainage, sidewalk, turn lanes at selected locations, street lighting, landscaping, utility relocations, and street paving. Phase 2 begins just north of the intersection of South Main at Fair Road, and continues north to Grady Street. The design is approximately 60% complete.

Staff initiated the proposed Contract Amendment 1, which proposes to add design work that was not included in the original contract for the design of turn lanes on West Jones Avenue and East Jones Avenue at South Main Street. Currently, there are no turn lanes on East or West Jones at South Main. The intersection experiences traffic delays associated with vehicles attempting to make left turns from East and West Jones onto South Main. Staff recommends addressing the issue as part of the Blue Mile Phase 2 project to reduce long-term overall cost by avoiding the need to reconstruct the roadway again at a later time to accommodate the turn lanes. The contract amendment includes additional surveying, roadway design, drainage design, utility relocation design, traffic signal design, GDOT permitting and coordination, and right of way plans.

Budget Impact: The original contract with TR Long is \$399,420. Proposed Contract Amendment 1 is \$44,000. ENG-115b has \$4,850,000 in 2018 TSPLOST funds budgeted for FY 2026, as well as \$2,900,000 in 2023 TSPLOST funds.

RE: Yard Spotter Truck for the Wastewater Treatment Plant

Policy Issue: Purchasing

Recommendation: Consideration of a motion to award a contract to Truck Country of Indiana for the purchase of a new Autocar Yard Spotter Truck per Sourcewell cooperative purchasing contract in the amount of \$135,000.00. This item to be purchased with funds approved in the FY2026 CIP Budget, items WTP-19, funded by system revenues.

Background: We are proposing to replace the existing 2001 Ottawa Yard Jockey Truck (25 years old) with a new unit, utilizing the Sourcewell cooperative purchasing contract (#032824-ATC). The existing yard jockey is well past its useful life and is no longer reliable for daily use. The new unit will be purchased through Truck Country of Indiana (Autocar dealer). The unit quote received was \$135,000.

Budget Impact: Funds were approved in the FY2026 CIP, WTP-19, utilizing system revenues. The purchase amount is \$15,000 over the \$120,000 budget amount, however, water sewer fund reserves are available to cover this amount.
