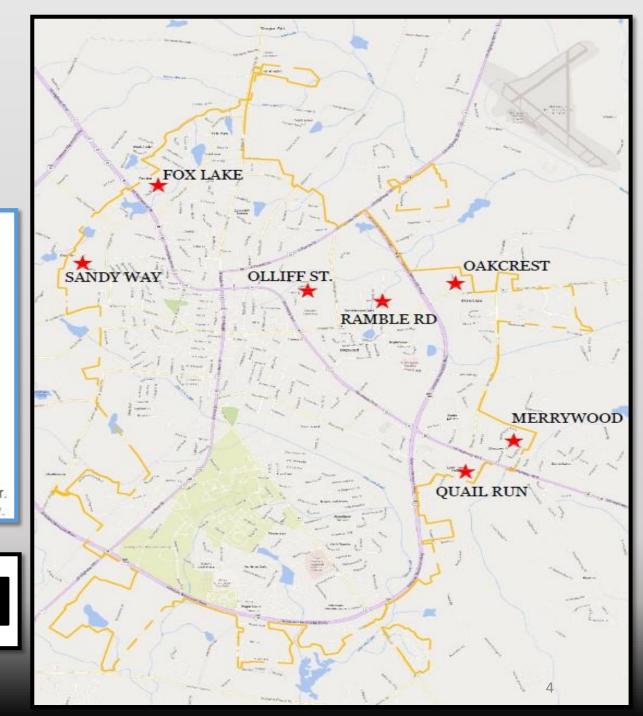

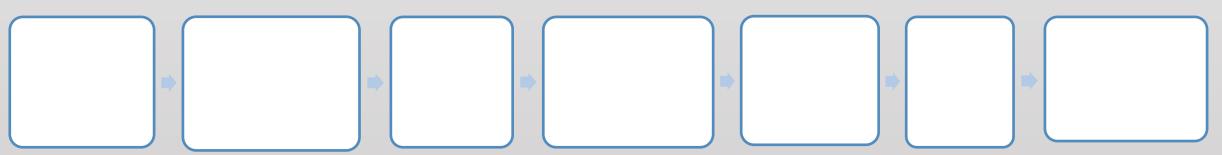
PROJECT LOCATION MAP

Dear Property Owner,

The City of Statesboro will be installing sanitary sewer mains into the ______ Subdivision. As a part of the project, the City will be connecting residents to the new sewer mains. The scope of this work will include crushing and filling of existing septic tanks (if they are accessible), running a new 4" sewer service from the septic tank to the sewer main at <u>no cost to the owner</u>. This work will only be performed during the time frame of the project. If an owner declines to connect to the sewer during this period, any future desire to connect to the City sewer will be at the homeowner's expense.

If you do connect to the sewer, your consumption will be based on the amount of water used during that billing cycle. Shown below is the current Water and Sewer rate schedule used for residential customers inside the city limits.

Water:	
Base Charge for water per month	\$7.50
0-9000 gallons per 1,000 gal	\$2.25
10-19000 gallons per 1,000 gal	\$2.35
20-49000 gallous per 1,000 gal	\$2.60
All over 49000 gallons per 1,000 gal	\$3.15
Sewer:	
Base Charge for sewer per month	\$7.50
0-9000 gallons per 1,000 gal	\$2.70

For Example:

If you are billed for 4,000 gallons of water and are connected to both water and sewer, you will be billed as follows:

Water Base Charge = \$7.50 4 x \$2.25= \$9.00 Sewer Base Charge = \$7.50 4 x \$2.70= \$10.80

Total Cost of Water/Sewer: \$34.80

Based on 4,000 of water consumption, being connected to sewer would increase your monthly utility bill by \$10.80.

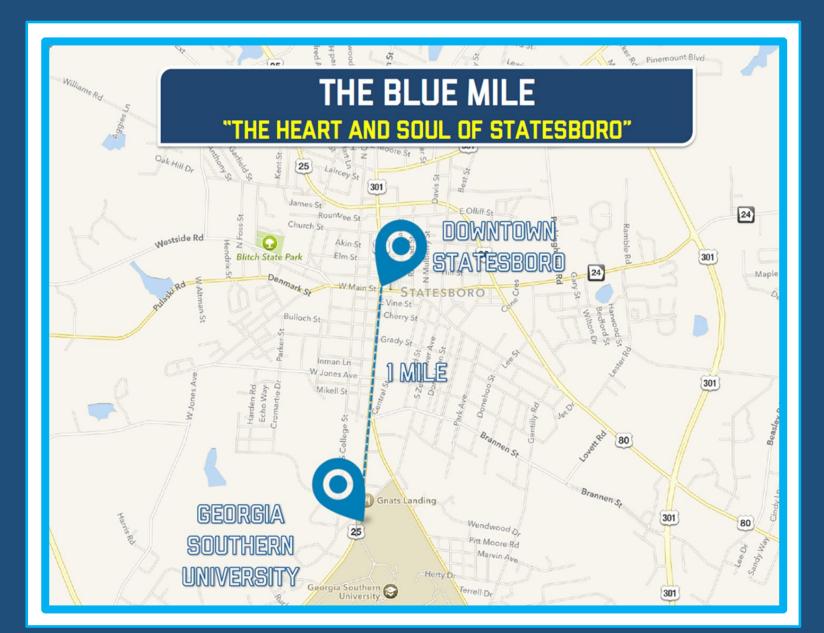

<u>Blue Mile Streetscape</u> <u>Improvements Project</u>

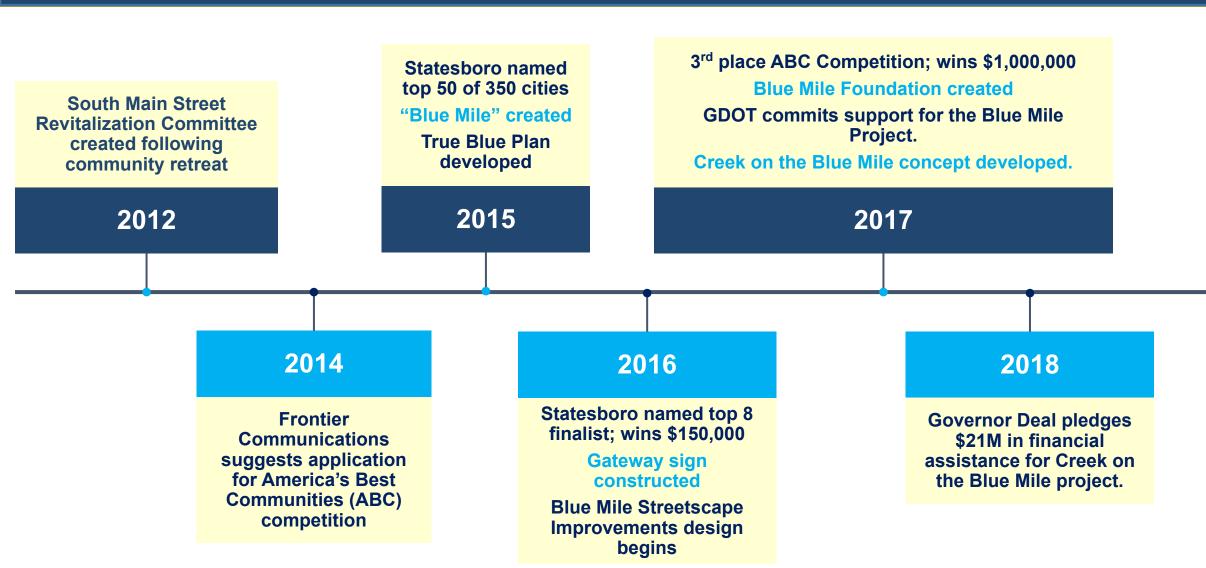
- 1. Drainage improvements
- 2. Utility relocation
- 3. New sidewalks and street surface
- 4. New decorative lighting with pole banners
- 5. Installation of bus shelters for the new transit program
- 6. Decorative crosswalks and enhanced driveway access points will provide safe crossing points for pedestrians
- 7. Landscaped pocket parks for pedestrians to pause along the Blue Mile.

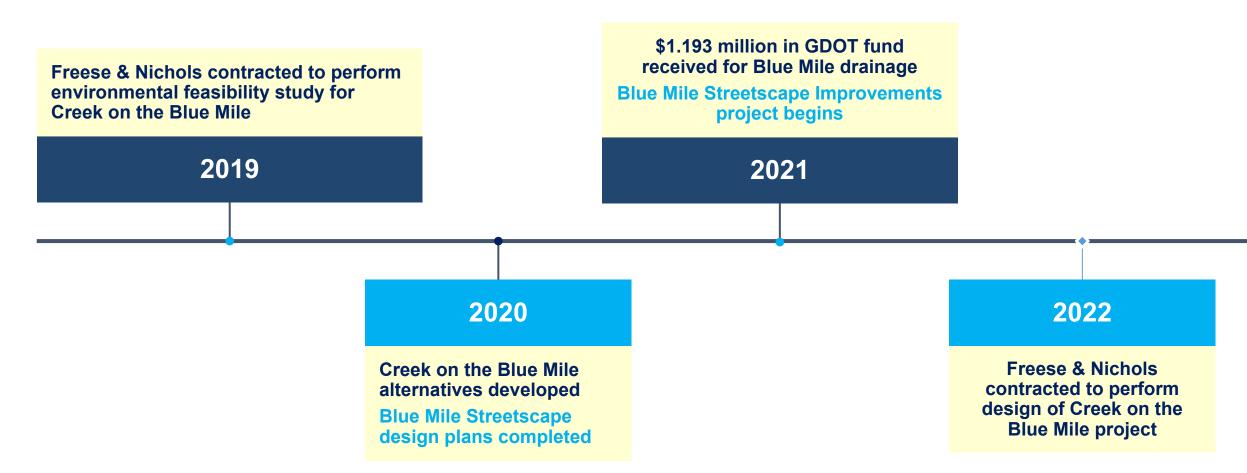
Blue Mile Timeline

<u>Blue Mile Streetscape Phase I</u> <u>Construction Update</u>

\$5.4 million construction cost

- Main power pole and line relocation complete
- Cable relocation complete
- Telephone relocation in progress
- Water main relocation complete
- Sewer main relocation complete
- Gas main relocation complete
- Stormwater infrastructure 85% complete
- Streetscape (curb, sidewalks, decorative streetlights, resurfacing, grassing, etc) 35% complete

<u>South Main Street / Fair Road</u> Intersection (roundabout) Update

- **\$5+ million estimated cost**
- City has committed to providing \$1.5 million match for property acquisition
- GDOT road safety audit complete
- GDOT has assigned project number
- GDOT consultant performing environmental study; concept has not been approved yet
- Current GDOT schedule: right of way acquisition in 2025; construction in 2026

Blue Mile Streetscape Improvements - Phase II & Phase III



Blue Mile Streetscape Improvements Phase II

- **\$5 million estimated construction cost (Fair Road to E/W Grady Street)**
- Relocation of overhead utilities (power, telephone, and cable) to underground
- Installation of drainage improvements
- Streetscape improvements (new curb, new sidewalks, decorative streetlights, resurfacing, etc)
- Pocket park(s)
- Will continue design elements from Phase 1
- Estimate Timeline: 2025-2027

<u>Blue Mile Streetscape Improvements Phase</u> <u>III</u>

\$5 million estimated construction cost (E/W Grady Street to E/W Main Street at courthouse)

- Relocation of overhead utilities (power, telephone, and cable) to underground and adjacent blocks
- Installation of drainage improvements
- Streetscape improvements (new curb, new sidewalks, decorative streetlights, resurfacing, etc)
- Will continue design elements from Phase 1
- Estimated Timeline: 2026 2028

In addition to the criteria as listed in Sec. 6-13(c), and subsequent to the qualifications threshold including personal qualifications, zoning compliance, minimum proximity requirements and proof of site control, the following criteria are proposed for consideration:



Additional Criteria

- 1. General Impact of location on surrounding area
- 2. Traffic Impact
- 3. Contribution to long-range viability/vision of the City
- 4. Potential redevelopment of property
- 5. Convenience of access/egress (to include new and existing curb cuts required for access)
- 6. Availability of parking



Additional Criteria (Continued)

- 7. Location within a TAD designated area
- 8. Location in DSDA area (exterior design review requirements)
- 9. Vehicle accident incidents
- 10. Economic return (dependent on size of operation)
- 11. Previous violations of alcoholic beverage laws or criminal activities
- 12. Effect on surrounding property values



Subsequent to grant of location reservation by Mayor and Council, the following steps would be required of applicant in order to receive building permits, obtain certificate of occupancy, and ultimately be granted license to sell distilled spirits by the package:

- 1. Review and approval of a parking plan showing layout of spaces, location of access and egress driveways and new curb-cuts (if any);
- 2. Review of external building design as per DSDA requirements (if located within the DSDA boundaries); and,
- 3. All building plans must reviewed and approved by the City.

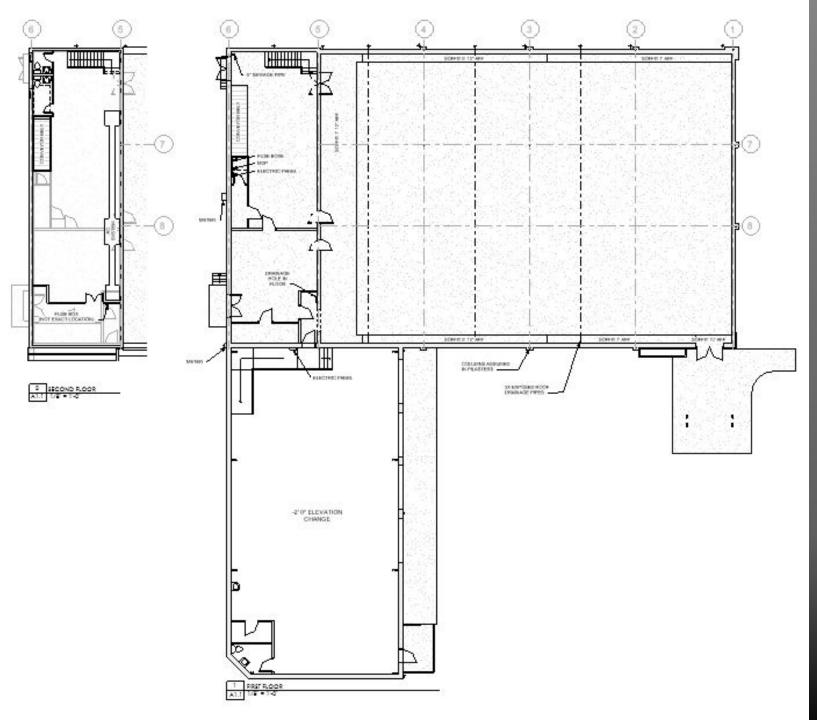

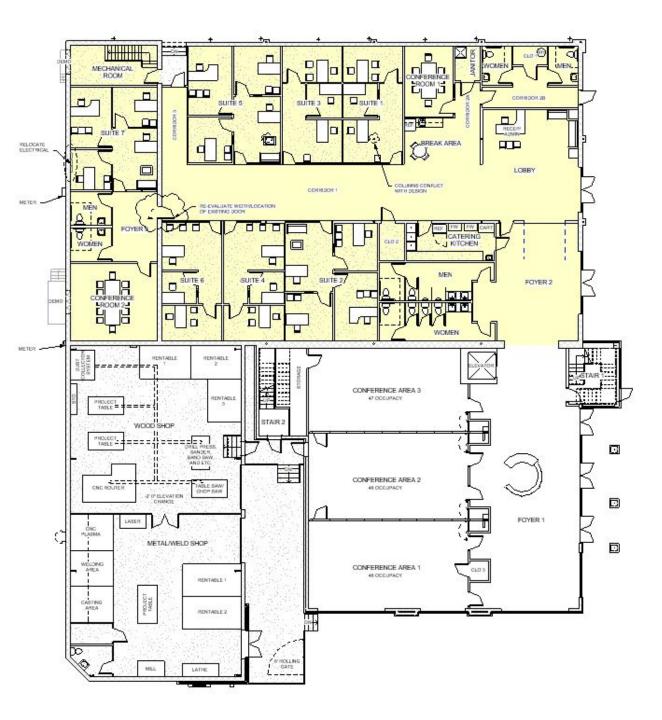






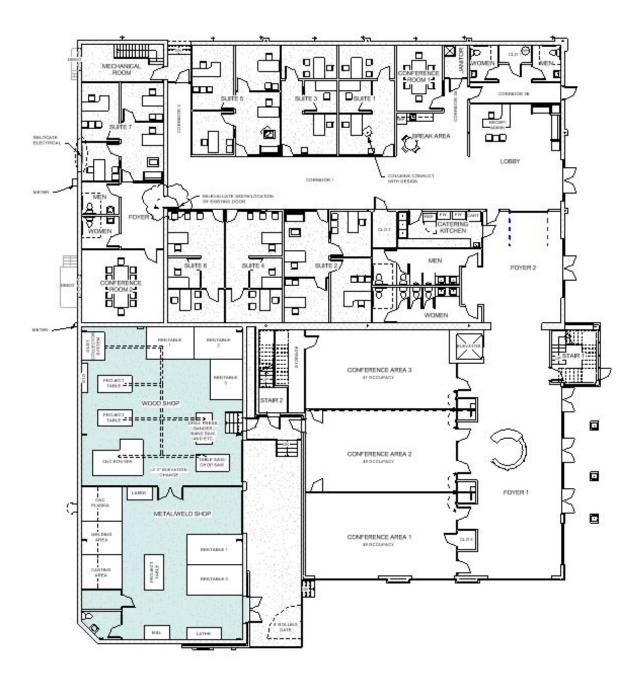
Overall Plan

 (with future additional grant)



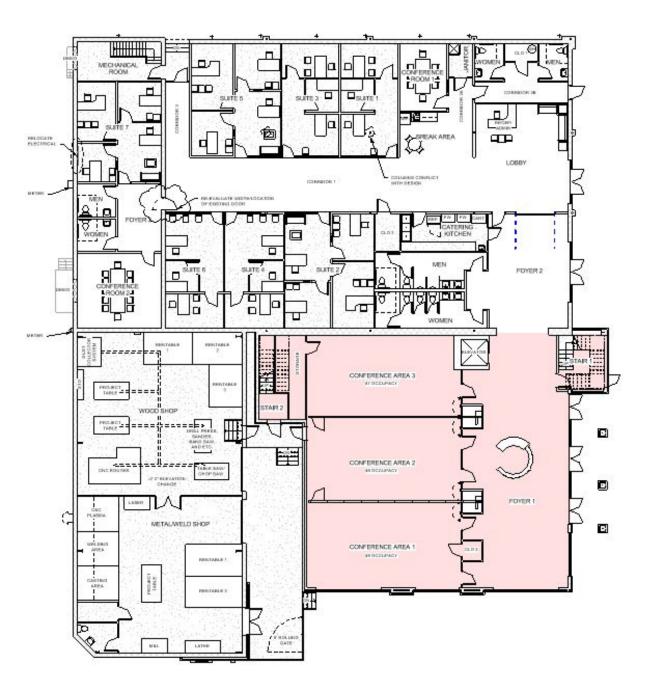
Business Incubator Offices

- Area of 7,800 SF
- Includes 3 Large Offices Suites (576 SF Each) and 4 Small Office Suites (370 SF Each).
- Also includes 2 Conference Rooms, 4 Staff Restrooms, Catering Kitchen, Lobby, and Restrooms for the Conference Building/Expansion.



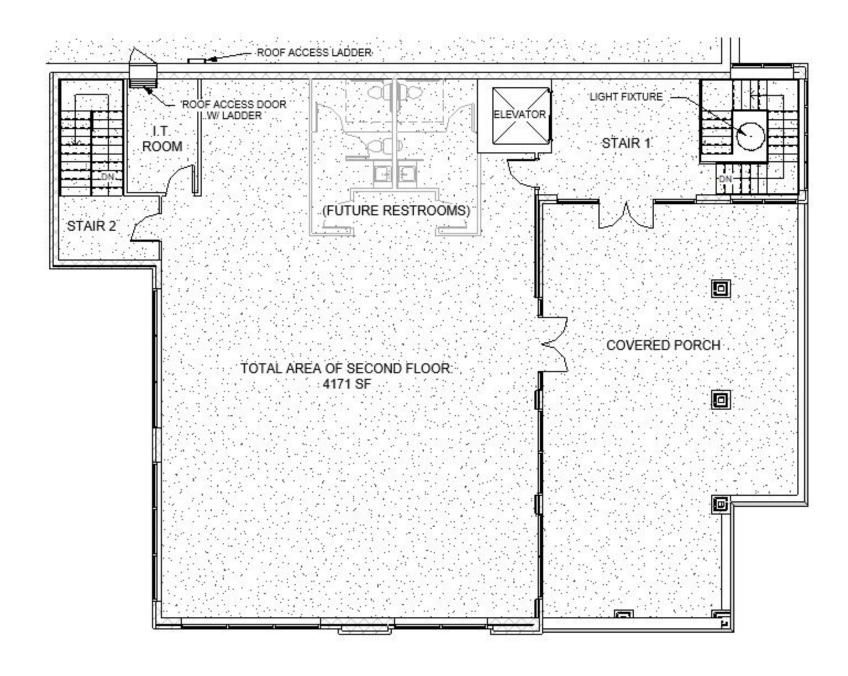
The FabLab

- Area of 3,000 SF
- Includes separated wood shop (1,600 SF) and welding shop (1,400 SF)
- Existing Restroom and Closet remain unchanged



The Expansion

- Area of 4,000 SF
- Includes 3 Conference Halls (700 SF Each) with occupant load of 50 people separated by operable partitions
- Also includes a lobby, storage room, an elevator, and two stair wells to *Second Story



Potential 2nd Story (If future grant is awarded)

- Total Area of 4,200 SF
- Covered porch (1,200 SF)
- Stair wells and elevator
- Future restrooms shown

- \$2,000,000 Economic

- \$500,000 City of Statesboro Match
- \$1,000,000 Additional –
 Possible Future Grant
