Statesboro Police Chief Mike Broadhead explained that on the morning of September 23, 2023 officers were dispatched to the area of Johnson Street and Spruce Street for a shooting in progress with multiple shots still being fired upon arrival. Two of the responding officers successfully took an armed subject into custody. Chief Broadhead continued that members of the Statesboro Police Department were confronted with a dangerous chaotic scene and in a short time were able to restore order and secure multiple crime scenes. He presented Meritorious Service awards to Officer Damien Truesdale and Communications Officer Sydney Johns and recognized Captain Jared Akins, Corporal Jessica Collins and APO Joey Deloach also recipients of the Meritorious Service award for their professional meritorious service to the community. In addition Chief Broadhead presented the Medal of Valor to Sergeant Nathaniel Janney and Officer Logan Gay for the arrest of one armed suspect.

### C) Presentation of the Medal of Valor to Officer Jonathan Treloar.

Statesboro Police Chief Mike Broadhead presented to Officer Jonathan Treloar the Medal of Valor, stating that back on May 5, 2023 Officer Jonathan Treloar responded to the area of Morris Heights apartments on a report of a juvenile with a firearm. Officer Treloar was able to take the suspect into custody and retrieve the pistol. The situation was tense and rapidly evolving and Officer Teloar displayed conspicuous valor at the risk of his own life.

Evan Bennett with Hussey Gay Bell and on behalf of the property owner spoke in favor of the request.

Lauretha Best a resident of Quail Run subdivision along with a neighbor Julius Tremble voiced their concerns regarding the proposed neighborhood using Timber Road as an access point and causing disruption in their neighborhood with the increased traffic. Ms. Best also stated that no sign was placed at the Quail Run entrance for the October 3<sup>rd</sup> Planning

Commission Meeting so they missed that meeting. She stated they are fine with the single family homes but would like a buffer or something in place to separate their neighborhood from the new development.

Mayor McCollar asked staff for some insight regarding these concerns.

Director of Planning and Development Kathy Field stated their concerns are more pointed to agenda item 10 which is a townhome subdivision. This development was originally going to be townhomes but after working with the developer is was changed to an R-6 development with single family homes. There are three roads that will be utilized for that R-6 development. These two subdivision plats are separate developments which is why the connector road is important as it provides a third means if egress and involves Stockyard Road, Timber Road, and Westside Road.

Councilmember Paulette Chavers stated that we sat down with members of the community, during the discussion, it was indicated that a sign would be placed on Timber Road and she is not pleased this did not happen. Secondly is there a way to avoid the entrance and exit not having to run through Timber Road because that seems to be the only issue at this point.

Evan Bennett with HGB stated there is no guarantee the Westside Road development will take place because it is a different owner. If it does not get developed then there would be no connection to Westside Road and would leave only one entrance for this development, which is not allowed by city requirements from a public safety standpoint.

City Manager Charles Penny stated there are other traffic calming things such as speed bumps that can be done which may discourage folks from using that particular road. In addition the absence of a sign on Timber Road was not done intentional it was miscommunication. Mr. Penny asked if council would give us some time to look at options and then this item can be brought back for consideration at the second meeting in November.

City Attorney Cain Smith explained the blight tax ordinance provides a mechanism and administrative procedure for designating properties as being blighted. A blighted property would be subject to a higher rate of taxation unless and until the blighted condition is remediated. When a blighted property is remediated the owner would receive a 50% taxation reduction for three years. The multiplying factor will be a part of the City's Schedule of Rates, Fines, and Fees adopted each year. This ordinance shall not apply to detached single family dwelling units, whether occupied or not.
