CITY OF STATESBORO WORK SESSION MINUTES OCTOBER 17, 2023

A Work Session of the Statesboro City Council was held on October 17, 2023 at 3:30 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall, 50 East Main Street. Present was Mayor Jonathan McCollar; Council Members: Paulette Chavers, Venus Mack and Shari Barr. Also present was City Clerk Leah Harden, City Attorney Cain Smith, City Manager Charles Penny, Assistant City Manager Jason Boyles and Public Information Officer Layne Phillips. Absent was Councilmembers John Riggs and Phil Boyum.

1. Personal Mobility Ordinance

Caleb Rasicot with TSW presented a follow up on the discussion at the last meeting on personal mobility devices. There are two types of regulations, shared mobility devices such as lime and general operations. Regulating these devices in two separate ways. The first way is applying a series of standards that apply to every device regardless of who owns it. The second is consolidating the standards related to a company coming in and requesting to use public right of ways to lease and rent scooters, separating the operations from the ownership. Caleb's presented the operational proposal to make several changes to chapter 48 of the city code that regulates all the various types of non-motorized devices. First amending part of the code 78-9 roller skates and skateboards renaming it nonmotorized devices, clarifying that it includes razor scooters and skateboards. Prohibiting these devices on any public street, only operate on sidewalks, and allowing mayor and council to prohibit them from certain parts of the city. Caleb also recommends adopting by reference all the state of Georgia's requirements for bicycles. Also to set very clear standards for the operations of electronic scooters in the City of Statesboro. Allow them on roadways with a speed limit of 35mph or less, allow on bicycle lanes, trails, and only on sidewalks when the adjacent roadway speed is over 35mph and the sidewalk is wide open 5 ft. because of the American Disability Act they cannot recommend anything lower than that. Along with recommending max speed of 15mph, minimum age 15, under 16 years of age you have to wear a helmet. It is recommended that chapter 70 is amended by adding the additional standards. City Manager Charles Penny recommends having sessions with the public and having their input, and bring back to another work session after hearing feedback from the public.

2. Alcohol License for Convenience Stores

City attorney Cain Smith presented the recommended amendment to 6-5(f) adding language to read application may be brought before mayor and council for consideration prior to acquiring a certificate of occupancy, but no license allowing sales shall be granted until such times as the certificate of occupancy is granted. Then add sect 6-5(r) licensees with multiple locations, licensees currently holding a package beer-wine licenses for two or more locations in the City of Statesboro shall be exempt from fingerprinting and background check requirements. City Attorney Cain Smith recommends both the addition to 6-5(f) and 6-5(r) to brought back for first reading at the next council meeting. Councilmember Venus Mack would like to have a time limit placed, a lot could happen in time, they could commit a crime in another state and we wouldn't know. Councilmember Shari Barr asked if you could background check without the fingerprinting. City Attorney Cain Smith stated background only goes with fingerprinting and the state does not do background checks on beer and wine. After further discussion direction was given to further amend the ordinance by adding if the licensee has been through the full application in the past 3 years and has 2 more locations they would be exempt and the place on the next November 7th regular meeting agenda for 1st reading.

3. Sewer Laterals

Assistant City Manager Jason Boyles stated the sewer lateral is the sewer line that runs from a house or structure to the city sewer main, sometimes the sewer main is in the right of way, in the roadway, under the roadway, across from your house, or in an easement outside of a public right of way. Currently the city's policy is the sewer lateral is the property owner's responsibility and not the city's. Staff recommends the city enact a sewer replacement assistance program for owner-occupied single-family home owners to mitigate the costly repair of the sewer lateral located within the public right of way of public utility easement. One way to enact the assistance program would be the unit price of impacted public improved surfaces and another would be based on depth. Our recommendation would be \$50/sf and \$50/lf. Will move forward with staff recommendation of an assistance program for owner occupied single family homes to mitigate the costly repair of a sewer lateral located within the public right of way or public utility easement.

4. Police Recruitment

City Police Chief Broadhead presented to Mayor and Council a graph showing staffing issues over the past 4 years, where employees are going, a snapshot of applicants hiring process in 2023, and stating that in exit interviews employees feel overworked and underpaid. Chief Broadhead went over the different ways they have been trying to recruit, as well as the incentives. Chief Broadhead is proposing \$2,500 signing bonus for non-certified, \$5,000 signing bonus for 3-5 years' experience and \$10,000 signing bonus for more than 5 years' experience, moving the entry level pay up to \$50,000. Retention would consist of pay raises commensurate with recommendations from Condrey and Associates, maintain ongoing training, maintain state certification, 5% pay for K-9 handler and S.W.A.T., with Condrey and Associates pay adjustments implemented by January 1st 2024.

5. Personnel Benefits

Human Resources Director Demetrius Bynes spoke to Mayor and Council about the upcoming 2024 employee benefits. Demetrius presented a graph showing employees by age and stated that claim rates start going up at the 40-49 age group, as well as showing in 2023 there has been less claims than in 2022 both in net and total claims. The proposed plan is for bi-weekly payroll premiums to remain the same for CY 2024; however, the out of pocket maximum and emergency room copays/coinsurance will increase. The emergency room visit will go from from \$100 to \$300 + 20% coinsurance with the gold plan and from \$100 to \$150 +20% coinsurance on the platinum plan. The wellness incentives include the biometric screening, annual physical and coaching- 2 or more risk factors get 2 coaching sessions and 4 or more risk factors will have 4 coaching sessions.

6. Development Projects for Statesboro

The meeting was adjourned at 5:23 pm.

Planning director Kathy Fields presented the Mayor and Council with the breakdown of all the new development that was approved with in the last couple of years. Approved developments include 377 single-family detached, 223 single-family attached, 914 townhomes, 517 multi-family, totaling 2031 new units. This number does not include smaller developments of less than 20. There are 216 multi-family units on Lovett Road, 90 townhome units on Westside Road, and 90 single-family detached units on Stockyard Road that are awaiting approval. Upcoming projects consist of 335 single-family and townhome units on Burkhalter Road, and 102 townhouse units on Langston Chapel Road.

Sec. 6-5. - Application procedure; contents of application; contents to be furnished under oath.

- (f)Fire and safety inspection. All businesses where alcohol is consumed on the premises shall satisfy all requirements of a fire and life safety inspection performed by the local fire official and city building official or his or her designee. The local fire official may cause to be inspected any building or portion of any building licensed under this ordinance. Application may be brought before Mayor & Council for consideration prior to acquiring a certificate of occupancy, but no license allowing sales shall be granted until such time as the certificate of occupancy is granted for the location.
- (r) Licensees with multiple locations. Ordinance 2023 - 18

Secs. 82.100 Private Sewer Laterals

- (a) Responsibility for the repair, replacement, and maintenance of the sewer lateral. The owner of the property or properties serviced shall be responsible for any portion of the private sewer lateral extending from a building to the public sewer main, including the wye connection that joins the private sewer lateral to the public sewer main. Any repairs, replacements or maintenance, such as clearing pipes using common industry hydro or mechanical cleaning tools, will not be provided by the city on private sewer laterals or in private sewer systems. Responsibility for such repairs, replacements and maintenance is that of the owner of the property or properties serviced by the lateral.
- (b) Determination. The city authorities or any agent of the city shall have the sole discretion to determine when repair and/or replacement is required due to unacceptable conditions of a sewer lateral.

Secs. 82.101 Sewer Lateral Replacement Assistance Program

- (a) Eligibility. There shall be an established sewer lateral replacement program to mitigate a portion of the cost to repair a private sewer lateral within the public right away. In order for a property owner to be eligible for the replacement assistance program, the following conditions must be met:
 - a. Be the owner and occupant of a single-family residential home located within the municipal limits. Proof of property ownership must be provided.
 - b. Prior to obtaining replacement assistance, all city bills (i.e., water/sewer, sanitation, etc.), City of Statesboro property taxes, licenses, and/or permits, including the occupational tax certificate if the owner operates a business within the city limits, must be paid in full.
 - c. The property owner must first have a licensed plumbing contractor video inspect their sewer line. A copy of the video inspection must be submitted with the replacement assistance application.
 - d. The property owner must then obtain and submit three quotes from a licensed plumbing contractor to submit with the replacement assistance application. Assistance will not exceed the lowest quote.
 - The property owner is responsible for contacting their insurance company to determine
 if any portion or the entire sewer lateral repair is covered by the homeowner's insurance
 policy.
- (b) *Ineligible for replacement assistance*. The following conditions are ineligible for replacement assistance:
 - a. The cost of interior clean-up or other damage to the interior of the home or personal property caused by sanitary sewer back-ups resulting from the failure of the sewer lateral or sanitary sewer main
 - b. The cost of removal and/or replacement of any site improvements (i.e., fences, trees, landscaping, etc.) necessary for excavation to repair or replace the sewer
 - c. The cost of lost wages or income to the home occupant or property owner due to absence from work necessary to work with contractors to complete the repairs
 - d. The initial cost of cabling or other methods to attempt to clear the blockage prior to the repair

- (c) Approval and repair process. Upon approval of the application, the property owner will be notified by city staff and instructed to contact the licensed plumbing contractor with the lowest quote. The licensed plumbing contractor will be required to obtain all the necessary permits prior to the property owner scheduling the work and will be required to obtain inspection of all work performed.
- (d) Basis for calculating replacement assistance. The city will assist with the cost of replacing impacted public improved surfaces (i.e., road, curb and gutter, sidewalk, etc.) at a specified amount per square foot as established in the schedule of fees and charges. Further, the city will assist with the replacement of the sewer lateral pipe per foot of depth in excess of 6' depth to be verified by city staff at a specified amount per linear foot of sewer lateral pipe as is established in the schedule of fees and charges.

Ordinance Amendment: Article V Collection Practices, Section 66-91 Residential Garbage Collection of Chapter 66 Solid Waste

Sec. 66-91. - Residential garbage collection. Current Ordinance

- (a) Garbage and solid waste at residences within the city shall be collected only by departments and employees of the city, or pursuant to a contract or franchise issued by the city. Removal by persons for hire or compensation is prohibited.
- (b) Collections from residential premises with a refuse receptacle shall be made once weekly, with the exception of holidays or in times when such collection is impossible, such as in the event of natural disasters.
- (c)(1) Resident(s) shall place garbage for curbside pickup in carts provided by the city. On the evening before each day assigned by the city sanitation superintendent for collection in the resident's area, the cart shall be placed at a curbside point designated by city sanitation officials no earlier than 6:00 p.m. for pick up the next day. The cart shall be removed from the curbside point by the resident no later than 8:00 a.m. on the day after the assigned collection date. Failure to remove a cart by 8:00 a.m. on the day after the assigned collection date shall result in a fine of \$10.00 per day until the cart is removed. Failure to remove a cart by 8:00 am on the day after the assigned collection date shall result in a fine per each occurrences as set forth in the schedule of fees. At other times, carts will be stored by the resident(s) where possible in locations not visible from the street or road on which the garbage is collected.



However, utility accounts that are assessed a 10% late charge shall not be charged the maximum rate of interest allowed for commercial accounts as provided for in O.C.G.A. 7-4-16.

AMENDED GRANT ADMINISTRATION MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)

Between

CITY OF STATESBORO

and

ACTION PACT, INC

This is an agreement between the City of Statesboro hereinafter called City and Action Pact, Inchereinafter called Administrator.

I. PURPOSE & SCOPE

The purpose of this MOU is to clearly identify the roles and responsibilities of each party as they relate to the administration and disbursements of utilities assistance made available by City funding.

Both Parties shall ensure that program activities are conducted in compliance with all applicable state and federal laws, rules, and regulations.

II. BACKGROUND

In order to aid and assist City residents and small businesses the City desires to fund aid programs to be administered by third party administrators having the requisite experience and expertise to evaluate aid applications and distribute the City funded aid to small businesses and residents in need.

III. CITY RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

City shall provide sixty two thousand dollars (\$62,000.00) to Administrator to fund a utilities assistance program. City shall pay Administrator an administrative fee equal to 10% of the amount of funding provided under the aid program. This administrative fee shall be paid separately by the City in order to preserve the totality of the \$62,000 being available to the citizens of Statesboro. City shall also aid Administrator in publicizing the aid availability through social media and City website. Administrator shall invoice the City by the 10th of each month for the amount paid out in direct benefits plus the 10% administrative fee.

IV. ADMINISTRATOR RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER THIS MOU

Administrator shall execute any and all such duties relating to aid administration including but not limited to provision of application forms, evaluation of applications, and disbursement of financial awards to qualified applicants under the following criteria and conditions::

1. The maximum amount of the grant is \$250 and shall be available for water, sewer, natural gas, and electricity, with priority given to water, sewer, and natural gas accounts;

- 2. Funds will be paid directly to the utilities provider;
- 3. Recipient must be City resident or have City utilities account; and
- 4. Administrator should attempt to be as flexible as possible to assist citizens to be eligible for the funds.

V. IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES THAT:

This MOU shall only be amended by mutual consent. Term shall be until the funding provided for in Section III is exhausted. Either party shall have right to cancel upon 30 days' written notice to other Party.

VII. RECORD REVIEW AND RETENTION

City shall have right to review all records pertaining to the administration of the program held by Administrator.

All records must be retained for three years from fiscal closure. This requirement applies to fiscal records, reports and applicant information.

VIII. EFFECTIVE DATE AND SIGNATURE

Background:

Originally, our insurance renewals were brought to Council to approve an extension to provide all of our insurance programs to end at the same time to provide an opportunity to bid them all as one complete package. This time frame will end on December 31, 2023. Due to our newly established employee medical clinic and our new provider (Everside), it is desired to continue our relationship with NFP and Anthem for one additional year to end December 31, 2024 to establish consistency and to operate with known processes as our new, on campus, clinic grows. At this point next year, it is felt the City will have plenty of historical data to successfully bid out our broker and health insurance services and that time. As to our general liability, workers compensation, cyber security and drone coverage, it is desired to extend these coverage for one additional year to coincide with our health insurance coverage. Again, this will allow the City to bid out all our policies at one time thus, providing the opportunity to gain a volume discount in the insurance market. In addition to this benefit, our current general liability and related insurance programs were set months ago to end for a short five (5) month period to end December 31 2024. By extending this policy for an additional year to coincide with our health insurance

coverage, we will benefit from avoiding the current vast increases in property/vehicle insurance factors. By extending our current coverages, we can avoid these increases by putting them off for an addition year in hope the market settles down. Renewal in this area would expose us to open market prices at this time. This decision to extend our current insurance programs in all areas was discussed by all involved departments of the City with unanimous agreement. Amounts may change throughout the year due to added employees and or vehicles and Equipment. It is our recommendation to extend all these insurance brokerage and carrier services for one year to end December 31 2024. If approved, we will begin the bidding process in the fall of 2024.

Staff recommends and requests award of contract to Solid Waste Applied Technology (SWAT) for the purchase of a New Way Automated Residential Side Arm (ASL) Refuse Collection body with a 2024/2025 Peterbilt 520 CNG Cab and Chassis per Sourcewell (formally NJPA) contract to SWAT in the amount of \$449,000.00. This item will be purchased with FY2024 Solid Waste Collection revenue funds.

Background:

The Solid Waste Collection Division is in the process of replace all refuse trucks with new models to improve services provided. Age and the normal wear on these trucks is causing them to become ineffective within 8 to 10 years due to repair and increasing maintenance down time. As part of this strategy, the division requests City Council approve the purchase for CNG side arm for the amount of \$449,000.00. SWAT requires a P.O. to be issued from the purchaser to secure a "slot" for the truck to be manufactured. This truck has an estimated delivery date of 1-2 years; however, the division needs a truck sooner but if a slot is not obtained, then delays are expected.

The Automated Side Arm (CNG) Refuse Collection Truck is to be funded in the amount of \$449,000.00 in the FY2024 budget and is listed under CIP# SWC-8-R. This truck will be outfitted with other safety equipment and decals with available funds budgeted; however, the equipment is in excess of the funds budgeted. This is due to current economic conditions across the United States, with suppliers experiencing supply chain shortages, as well as price increases. The balance will come from fund balance in solid waste collection fund, which has reserve funds to cover this expense.

The Sourcewell Contract # 091219-NWY, meets all requirements, specifications and warranty needed. This machine is on a 5/10 year rotation (front line/backup machine) to minimize the downtime and maintain operational efficiency due to the continuous work load of the commercial division.

Budget Impact: Funding from Operating Income. A reduction in maintenance costs
