Present were Mayor Jonathan McCollar, Council Members: Phil Boyum, Sam Lee Jones, Jeff Yawn, John Riggs and Derek Duke. Background: Statesboro voters passed a resolution on November 6, 2018 authorizing the City of Statesboro to allow alcohol sales at restaurants to commence as early as 11:00A.M. on Sundays in accordance with revised Georgia law. Council action is required to implement the voter resolution.

Ordinance 2018 - 13

Chapter 6-7

(n) Hours of operation. The following hours of operation shall apply to the sale of alcoholic beverages licensed hereunder:

(1) All licensed premises for the sale of retail beer and/or wine by the drink or retail liquor by the drink (Class D, E and F licenses) shall only engage in the sale and service of alcoholic beverages upon the licensed premises, at a permitted outdoor event, or a permitted catered event between the hours of 7:00 am and 1:00 am the following day Monday through Saturday. Sale and service of alcoholic beverages pursuant to this subsection that begins on Saturday may continue until 1:00 a.m. Sunday morning without a Sunday sales permit.

(2) Only licensed premises for the sale of retail beer and/or wine by the drink or retail liquor by the drink (Class D, E and F licenses) which maintains a valid Sunday sales permit may begin the sale and service of alcoholic beverages on Sunday. All licensed premises for the sale of retail beer and/or wine by the drink or retail liquor by the drink (Class D, E and F licenses) which begins the sale and service of alcoholic beverages on Sundays shall only engage in the sale and service of alcoholic beverages upon the licensed premises, at a permitted outdoor event, or a permitted catered event between the hours of 12:30 p.m. 11:00 a.m. and midnight on Sunday.

(3) All licensed premises for the package sales of beer and wine for off-premises consumption (Class B and C licenses) shall only engage in the sale of alcoholic beverages between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and midnight current time, Monday through Saturday.

(4) Only licensed premises for the package sales of beer and wine for off-premises consumption (Class B and C licenses) which maintain a valid Sunday sales permit may sell alcoholic beverages on Sunday from 12:30 p.m. through 11:30 p.m.

Policy Issue: Statesboro Code of Ordinances: Chapter 58 (Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions) subsection regarding misdemeanor possession of marijuana within the corporate limits of the City of Statesboro as follows:

Sec. 58-12– Marijuana. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess one ounce or less of marijuana within the corporate limits of the City of Statesboro. Any person found guilty of violating this section shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00. Where the Court finds that a defendant is without the financial means to pay a fine, the Court may direct the defendant to perform community service commensurate with the fine that would otherwise be imposed. In no event shall any person convicted of marijuana possession pursuant to this section be punished by imprisonment for any term. Any defendant charged hereunder with possession of one ounce or less of marijuana shall be entitled on request to have the case against the defendant transferred to the court having general misdemeanor jurisdiction in Bulloch County.

Recommendation: Second reading

Background: Several other local governments in the state of Georgia have passed ordinances regarding misdemeanor possession of marijuana.

ORDINANCE 2018-14

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 58, OFFENSES AND MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF STATESBORO, GEORGIA TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR POSSESSION OF MARIJUANA; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the City of Statesboro has an interest in maintaining the public safety and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Statesboro and its visitors; and

WHEREAS, the City is committed to creating a safer Statesboro by reducing crime, working to ensure the safety of its citizens and fostering a relationship of trust and partnership within the community; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-32-6(a) and (c), Statesboro Municipal Court is vested with jurisdiction to try and dispose of cases where a person is charged with possession of one ounce or less of marijuana when the offense occurs within the corporate limits of the City of Statesboro; and

WHEREAS, any fines and bond forfeitures arising from the prosecution of such cases shall be retained by the City pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 36-32-6(b); and

WHEREAS, currently there is no ordinance setting punishment for possession of less than one ounce of marijuana within the corporate limits of the City as authorized by the state; and

WHEREAS, enactment of an ordinance concerning the offense of simple marijuana possession within City limits is intended to enhance public safety and eliminate costs by reducing the amount of time police officers spend in connection with the arrest, processing and transportation of those accused of simple marijuana possession; and

WHEREAS, enactment of an ordinance concerning the offense of simple marijuana possession is further intended to prevent young people from entering the criminal justice system and avoiding the enduring stigma associated therewith; and

WHEREAS, it is not the intent of the City Council to legalize or otherwise decriminalize the possession of marijuana within the corporate limits of the City; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of Mayor and City Council to specifically provide that a person convicted of a violation of Section 58-12 shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00, or community service should the Court find financial circumstances so-dictate, and shall not be punished by a term of any imprisonment.

<u>BE IT ORDAINED</u> by the Mayor and Council of the City of Statesboro, Georgia, in regular meeting of Council assembled, and pursuant to lawful authority thereof:

<u>SECTION</u> <u>1</u>: That Chapter 58, Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, , of the Code of the City of Statesboro, Georgia be amended by inserting Section 58-12 entitled "Marijuana" as follows:

Sec. 58-12– Marijuana. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess one ounce or less of marijuana within the corporate limits of the City of Statesboro. Any person found guilty of violating this section shall be punished by a fine not to exceed \$500.00. Where the Court finds that a defendant is without the financial means to pay a fine, the Court may direct the defendant to perform community service commensurate with the fine that would otherwise be imposed. In no event shall any person convicted of marijuana possession pursuant to this section be punished by imprisonment for any term. Any defendant charged hereunder with possession of one ounce or less of marijuana shall be entitled on request to have the case against the defendant transferred to the court having general misdemeanor jurisdiction in Bulloch County.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

<u>SECTION 3</u>: This ordinance shall be effective January 1, 2019.

Ordinance 2018-15

Sec. 2-2.4. – Presentation of Code of Ordinances Revisions to Mayor and Council

a) Proposed revisions to the Code of Ordinances shall be brought up as an agenda item at a regularly scheduled meeting of Mayor and Council or during "other business" of a regularly scheduled meeting. The person(s) requesting the revision shall present explanation and reason for making the proposed revision to Mayor and Council. Suggestions for revisions to the Code of Ordinances shall only be made by the Mayor, Council or City staff. Any citizen, board or outside organization wishing to make a suggestion for revision shall contact their District Council representative or the Mayor, who may sponsor the idea before Mayor and Council.

b) An affirmative vote of a majority of quorum of Mayor and Council shall move the ordinance revision forward with a directive that the City Attorney draft proposed revision language. Vote to do so shall be taken in accordance with existing standard voting guidelines as outlined in the Charter.

c) The City Attorney shall then prepare a draft of the revision. In the case of a proposed revision to an existing ordinance, the City Attorney shall prepare a document that shows the existing ordinance in its current form with proposed additions and deletions notated in a comprehensible manner on a single copy. If intent to proceed with revision under (b) has been properly made, the City Attorney may present a so declared preliminary revision at a regularly scheduled meeting of Mayor and Council in order to facilitate discussion and seek input from Mayor and Council during the revision drafting process. A preliminary revision shall not be considered for passage by Mayor and Council. Public hearing on a proposed revision may only be allowed upon motion of Mayor and Council though it is not required for a preliminary revision to move forward.

d) Once the City Attorney has substantially prepared the proposed ordinance revision it should be presented as a First Reading and Public Hearing, which shall be run according to standard Charter meeting guidelines. Mayor and Council may vote in the affirmative to move the ordinance, as then presented or with only minor modification, forward to Second Reading. Substantial changes made to revision presented at First Reading shall require modified revision to be presented as a First Reading at a subsequent meeting of Mayor and Council.

e) Second Reading: Mayor and Council may move to approve or deny the revision as presented in the publicly available meeting agenda. Scrivener's errors may be corrected, but no substantive modifications to proposed revision shall be considered for passage.

f) Upon recommendation of City staff and unanimous vote of quorum of Mayor and Council the formalities contained herein may be waived.

The Department of Planning & Development has reviewed the alcoholic beverage application submitted by Aziz Ashim for 195 Northside Drive East (Tax Parcel # MS84000100B000). The applicant is proposing the sale of retail beer by the drink at this location. The proposed sale of alcohol is permitted at the location and the application **may be approved**. Staff's recommendation is based on the following:

1) Zoning District: 195 Northside Drive East is located in the CR (Commercial Retail) zoning district. Sale of beverages is permitted in this district.

2) General Regulations Pertaining to all Licenses: Per Chapter 6 Section 6-7(c)(2) of the *Statesboro Code of Ordinances*, Class D, E and F alcoholic beverage licenses may be issued in the CR (Commercial Retail) zoning district.

3) Alcoholic Beverages Proximity Restrictions: The Department of Planning & Development has reviewed the subject property for consistency with the proximity restrictions of Chapter 6 Section 6-7(d) of the *Statesboro Code of Ordinances*. The proposed location is required to adhere to the regulations set forth by O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21. As per Chapter 6(d)1, Class D, E, and F licenses shall be issued for a location only if the location complies with the proximity requirements provided by O.C.G.A. § 3-3-21 as measured by the rules and regulations promulgated by the Georgia Department of Revenue. As of the date of this document, the attached survey shows no encroachment of any prohibited. This license is a renewal of a previously approved license, and will not require a new survey for approval.

Late Payments:

The late payment charge referenced in Section 66-6(e) of the solid waste ordinance, in Section 82-38(b) of the natural gas utility ordinance, in Section 82-70 (b) of the water service utility ordinance, section 82068 of sanitation sewer utility service and in Section 82-271 of the Stormwater ordinance shall be 10% of the outstanding principal balance.

Unless otherwise agreed to in writing by an obligor or otherwise provided for by general law or ordinance, obligations for the payment of money to City that arise out of a transaction to sell or furnish, or the sale of, or furnishing of, goods or services by the city to an obligor are commercial accounts, and shall be assessed the maximum rate of interest allowed for commercial accounts as provided for in O.C.G.A. 7-4-16. However, utility accounts that are assessed a 10% late charge shall not be charged the maximum rate of interest allowed for commercial accounts as provided for in O.C.G.A. 7-4-16.

Recommendation:

Motion to award a contract to Patrol PC for the purchase of Rhinotab rugged mobile laptops and related equipment to be placed in patrol vehicles in the amount of \$52,236.00. If approved, this purchase will be funded under CIP# PD-1 from the allocated funds provided by the recent 1 mill increase.

Background:

These proposed mobile laptops are to be placed in our Police patrol vehicles. Currently, we use Dell brand laptops that have a life of approximately three years at a cost of approximately \$1,800.00 each. The proposed Patrol PC Rhino Tab laptops will cost \$3,699.00 each and have an estimated life of 7-8 years. While this will provide some savings over time, technology related down time is projected to be significantly less due to the durable nature of these units. This will save officer down time as well as reduce IT related services required to keep these patrol units operating. Due to the extreme Police work environment, the current laptops in use often are in need of constant repair (screens, keyboards, etc.) If approved, the purchase of these laptops would be on a sole source justification due to Patrol PC is the only manufacture of rugged customized laptops with the sole purpose of being placed in patrol and emergency service situations. If approved, this total purchase would be for 9 of these laptops with all related equipment (software, keyboards, mounting equipment etc.) in the amount of \$52,236.00.

RE: Vacation Buy Back for Employees Exceeding the Maximum Allowable Accumulation

Policy Issue: The personnel policy sets a maximum allowable accumulation of vacation leave (30 days) to be carried over into the next calendar year. The policy also allows the City Manager to authorize exceptions to the maximum allowable accumulation due to unusual circumstances. In the Budget's Fringe Benefit Summary, there is a section referenced Vacation Buy Back: Upon the recommendation of the Department Head and the City Manager, an employee so requesting, may receive pay in lieu of one week of vacation leaver per year if, on December 31st of that year, their annual leave accumulation exceeds 30 days. Vacation Buy Back is temporarily suspended for FY2019.

Recommendation: Due to various unforeseen circumstances in the City Departments, i.e. short staffing, it is recommended to allow employees having in excess of the maximum allowable 336 hours for Fire Shift employees and 240 hours all other employees to "Buy Back" those hours over the maximum. Employees may buy back the number of hours it takes to reach the maximum allowable hours for their position up to 40 hours after December 31 leave accrual.

Budget Impact: \$55,000. Due to the vacancies across the organization, this amount will be paid from the personnel line items.
